
I am a Masonry contractor and looking forward to retiring very soon.

## PFC Clifford Mills WWII MIA March 30, 2019



The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced that Army Pfc. Clifford M. Mills, 29, of Troy, Indiana, killed during World War II, was accounted for on Jan 29, 2019.

In September 1944, Mills was a member of the 319th Glider Field Artillery Battalion, 82nd Airborne Division, which participated in Operation Market Garden, the invasion of the Germany occupied Netherlands. On Sept. 18, 1944, Mills was reported missing in action in the vicinity of Wyler and Zyfflich, Germany.

PFC Mills was laid to rest on March 30, 2019 at the Troy Cemetery in Troy Indiana.

May he now rest in peace.

# R.O.T.C. Dinning Out Ball April 5, 2019







## Private Fred Freet USMC WWII MIA Funeral Services, April 18, 2019



The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced today that Marine Corps Reserve Pvt. Fred E. Freet, 18, of Marion, Indiana, killed during World War II, was accounted for on Aug. 6, 2018.

During the morning hours of November 20, 1943, United States Naval ships approached Betio Island on the Tarawa Atoll. Betio was a stronghold for the Japanese, and gaining control of its airstrip could prove to be strategically valuable to the American advancement through the pacific islands. Following three hours of early morning bombing and cover fire from US Naval aircraft and destroyers, American soldiers prepared to make an amphibious assault on the island. This assault would be the start of a WWII battle that would last 76 hours and claim the lives of over a thousand U.S. Marines.

Private Freet funeral services will be on April 18th at the Needham- Storey - Wampler Funeral Home, 1341 N. Baldwin Ave., Marion, IN.

The family of private Freet, have requested the Indiana Patriot Guard to establish a flag line at the funeral home starting at 9:30 a.m. Following the funeral services, Private Freet will be escorted to his final resting place at the Marion National Cemetery in Marion Indiana.

**Please plan on attending Private Freet's funeral services on Thursday April 18th.** Private Freet's arrival time at the Indianapolis Airport and escort has not been announced yet. Please monitor your email for last minute updates.

## **Membership Patches**



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder ® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.



The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing ,they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, which is the property of National. A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.



**The Junior Membership patch.** The Junior Membership patch is available to individuals that wish to join the Chapter that are under the age of 18 years old. Once the Junior Member becomes 18 years old, they will be able to become a full Chapter member and eligible for the Chapter boot, Rocker and Eagle patches when they meet the requirements. The Junior Membership patch is no cost to the Junior Member.

# **POW\*MIA Chair of Honor Project**

In 2019, we have three POW\*MIA Chair of Honor displays that we are working on for three different venues. **The venues include**: The Plainfield High School Plainfield, Indiana, the Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery Madison Indiana, and the Grissom Air Force Base Museum Peru Indiana.

**Plainfield High School**. The Chair has been completed, and the Plainfield students are working on the platform that the chair will be mounted on. As soon as the students complete the platform, we will be able to determine a dedication date.

**Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery**. The cemetery provided a chair that will be used for the Chair of Honor. The chair was taken to the upholstery shop to be reupholstered with the POW/MIA theme. Dick Harrington has completed building the platform that the POW\*MIA Chair of Honor will be mounted on. The projected dedication date will be **May 11, 2019** when we ride down to Madison for the Veterans Memorial Ride.

**Grissom Air Force Base Museum.** The museum provided a seat from a C119 plane that will be used for the POW\*MIA Chair of Honor. This seat will be a little more challenging and will require more work. The Golden Knights, is scheduled to appear September 7-8 at the Grissom's Air and Space Expo. We are hoping to have the POW\*MIA Chair of Honor display completed by September so the Chair can be dedicated during the expo.


