
39th Annual Mid-West Swap Meet April 9th and 10th

Fallen IMPD Officer Breann Leath 1995 - 2020



The Chapter has been invited to attend the Scholarship presentation to Zayne Bartolome, the son of Officer, Breann Leath who was killed in the line of duty on April 9, 2020.

Officer Leath's story:

Police were called to the Harrison Terrace apartments in the 1800 block of Edinburgh Square, which is just southwest of 21st Street and North Franklin Road, around 2:50 p.m. for a domestic disturbance. Officer Breann Leath, 24, was responding to a domestic incident at an apartment at 1803 Edinburgh Square when she was shot.

Officers were called to the apartment for a domestic incident, IMPD Assistant Chief Chris Bailey said. When they arrived, shots were fired and the officer and a female inside the apartment were shot. They were both rushed to the hospital. Officer Breann Leath died at the hospital. She was 24 years old and a graduate of Southport High School.





As of March 31, 2022 we have 4,780 POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. The funds generated from the sale of the POW/MIA Specialty plate goes towards helping our Indiana Veterans in need through the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF).



To be eligible, the applicant must be a resident of Indiana, and have a verifiable family relationship to a former Prisoner of War (POW) or an Missing in Action (MIA). The essay topic for 2022 is "The History of United States Prisoner of War (POW) and Missing in Action (MIA)".

Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rocker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.



The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing ,they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, which is the property of National. A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.

Membership Obligations

Retrieve Patches: It's the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not renew dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package **CERTIFIED** or **PRIORITY** mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

Indiana WWII Medal of Honor Recipient PVT William D McGee





Born in 1923, McGee joined the Army from his birth city of Indianapolis, Indiana in 1943, and by March 18, 1945 was serving as a private in the Medical Detachment of the 304th Infantry Regiment, 76th Infantry Division.

On that day, near Mülheim, Germany, he voluntarily walked into a minefield to aid two comrades who had been wounded by anti-personnel mines. After carrying one man to safety, he returned to rescue the second man but stepped on a mine and was himself seriously wounded. He ordered his fellow soldiers to stay out of the minefield and not risk their safety by trying to rescue him; McGee died of his injuries the next day.

For these actions, he was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor a year later, on February 26, 1946.


