# USS Indianapolis Memorial Service

## 75th Anniversary

July 30, 2020

On Thursday July 30<sup>th</sup>, a few Rolling Thunder® members and others attended the USS Indianapolis Memorial service on the canal. It was a good service and I learned a lot about the history of USS Indianapolis. The USS Indianapolis delivered the ATOMIC bomb that changed the course of the War.

On the return trip from delivering the ATOMIC bomb, the Japanese sunk the USS Indianapolis with 1,195 Sailors and Marines aboard. 879 were lost at Sea with 316 survivors, and only (8) remaining alive.

The USS Indianapolis has a lot of history that all Indiana Hoosiers should know about. If you have never been on the canal to see the USS Indianapolis Memorial, you need to make the trip.

Matt’s family ran a Yellow Ribbon center in Batavia Ohio. The Chapter use to stop at the Yellow Ribbon center on our way to Washington D.C. Matt’s father Keith, would brief the Chapter on the search for Matt until his remains were found and returned home in 2008.

The Celebration of Life for Wally was at the Veterans Memorial Park, Richmond, Indiana. It was a nice service with Tony Gigli presenting Ms. Dudek with the Gene Gigli award for Excellence and Dedication in honor of Wally.

The Veterans Memorial Park is a nice park with memorials for each war. If you have never been to this park, you need to put it on your bucket list.

## **Chapter Elections**

In accordance with the National Constitution, all members will be duly notified of elections by an announcement at the June, July and August meeting. Listed below, and Pages 10-13 contain important information about the Chapter election process.

As a member of the Chapter, it is your duty to maintain your membership in good standing and participate in the Chapter election. **Nominations for the positions listed on page 9 will be taken at the August Chapter meetings only. You MUST be present to accept a nomination. Nominations will not be taken using Zoom.** The Chapter election will be at the September 20, 2020 Chapter meeting.

- Only Rolling Thunder® members in good standing are eligible to vote.
- To be a member in good standing, you must have attended (3) Chapter meetings and (3) Chapter events with the membership year.
- Nominations will be taken at our July and August Chapter meetings only with the elections being held at our September 20th Chapter Meeting.
- The member being nominated must have attended six (6) Chapter meetings in the last twelve (12) months.
- **Therefore, the nominee attendance requirement will be six (6) Chapter meetings and three (3) events within the membership year.**
- The membership year is from September 1, 2019 to August 31, 2020.
- In accordance with Indiana Chapter #1, Chapter Rules, dated 19 January 2020, any member wishing to run for the office of President, or Chairman of the Board, must first have held another office, i.e.: Treasure, Secretary, or Board member, for a full term, with Indiana Chapter #1.
- Any qualified patch wearing (Rocker/Eagle) Chapter Member in good standing may run for the Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, or Board Member position.

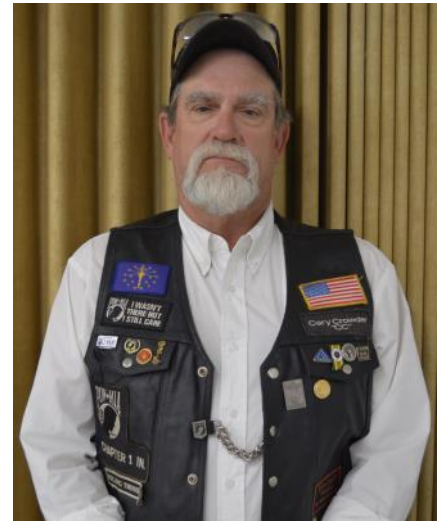

The Chapter Vice President is an elected official with a (2) year term. The Chapter Vice President enhances the organization's public standing by clearly articulating the Rolling Thunder mission statement, accomplishments, and goals to the public and garners support from the community.

**The duties of the Chapter Vice President will include, but not limited to the following duties:**

- Disbursement of the funds of the Chapter as directed by the Board of Director after approved by the Membership, and will comply with the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution.

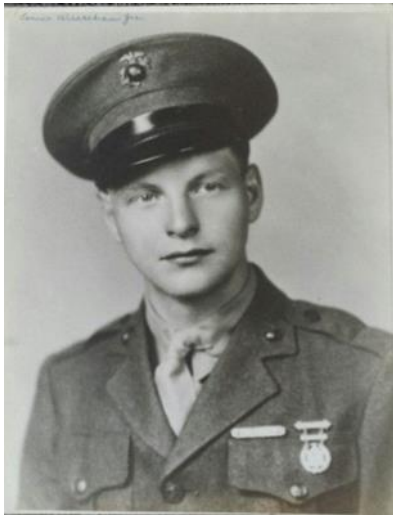
### **Duties and Responsibilities Description**

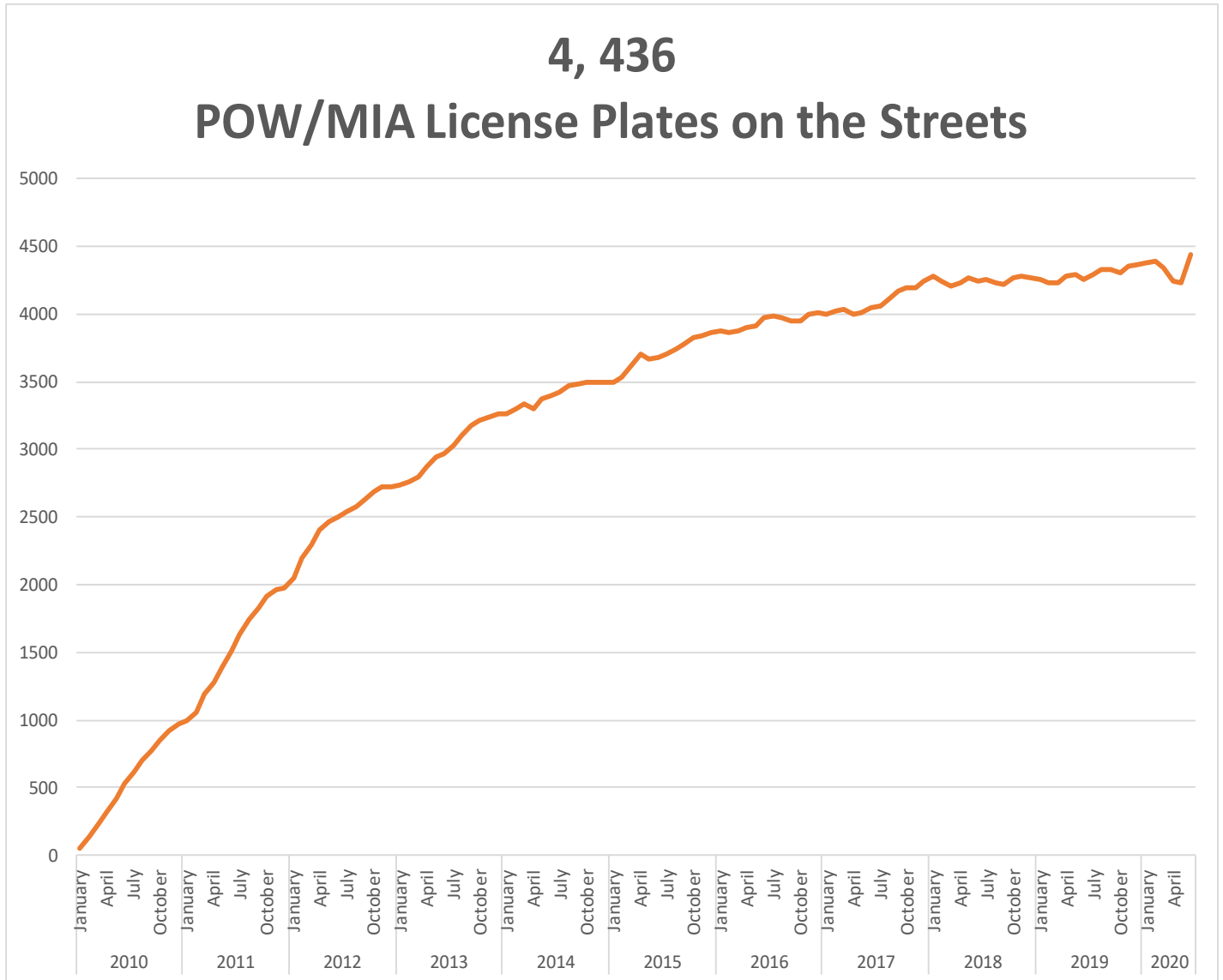

As of June 30, 2020

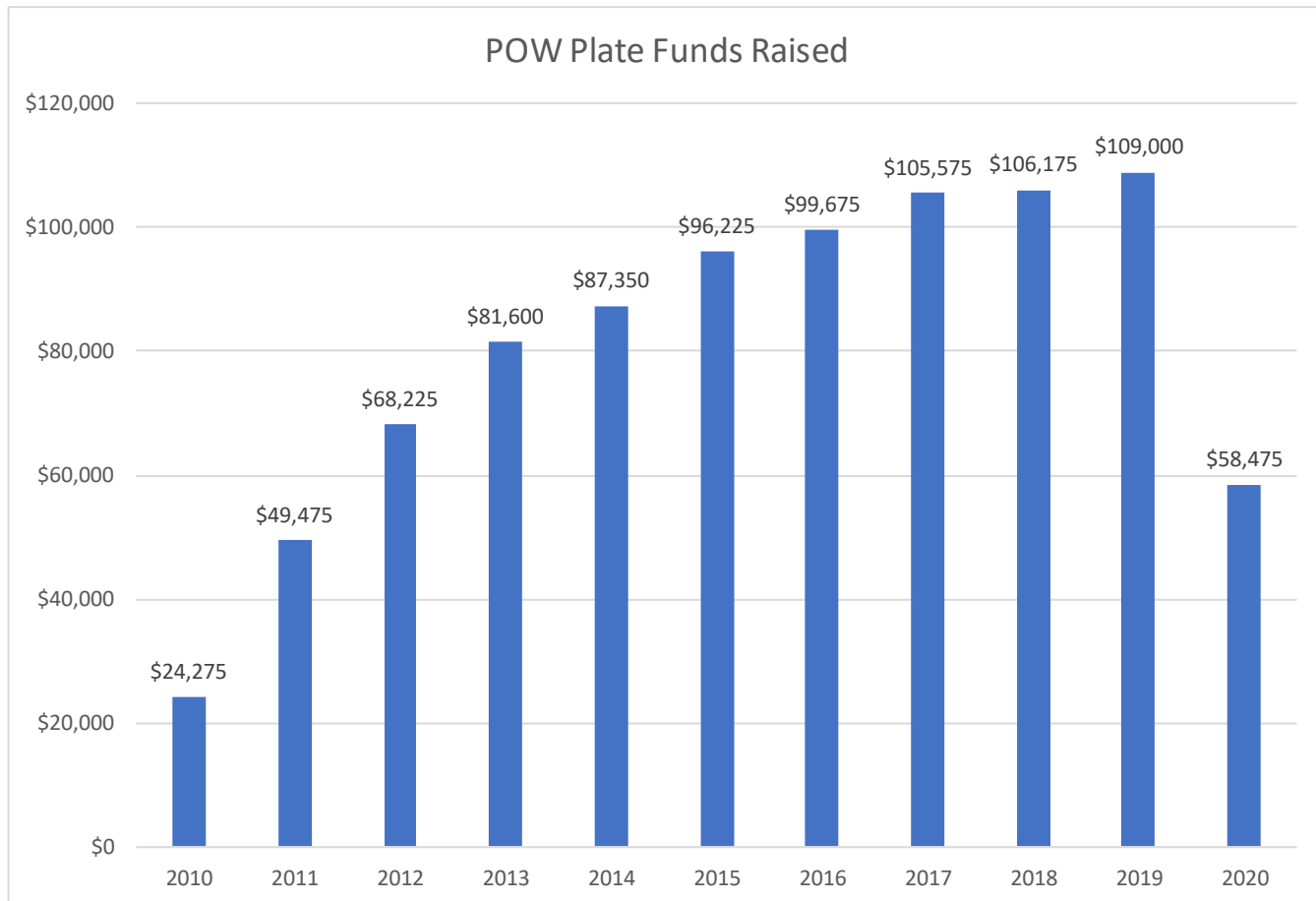


As of June 30, 2020 we have **4,436** POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. To date, we have **(12)** POW\*MIA Chairs of Honor installed in venues throughout Indiana. Our first COH was installed at the Lucas Oil Stadium on November 2, 2014 and the latest one at the Plainfield High School on September 19, 2019.

These special chairs will remind thousands of people of the men that fought for our freedom and still need to come home, live or dead.

The placement of these special chairs in High Schools is specialty important to remind the younger generations of the cost of war and the price of freedom.
