In Memory of Richard “Dick” Harrington

May 17, 1947 - January 17, 2022



Dick and Linda joined Rolling Thunder in 2005. Dick eventually took the position as Board Member and later as Chairman of the Board. Dick has accomplished a lot during his 16 years as a member of Rolling Thunder. In 2008, Dick managed a Harley Davidson bike raffle that generated **\$45,819** dollars for the Rouderbush VA Hospital.

Dick was instrumental in the Chapters effort to obtain an Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate to help bring awareness to the public about our POWs/MIAs, and to generate funds to help our Indiana Veterans in need.

In 2010, the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty plate became a reality and was announced at our May 2010 Ride to the Wall send off program at Harley Davidson of Indianapolis. From 2010 to 2015 the funds generated from the POW/MIA Specialty plate went to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund to be distributed to the Post 9/11 Veterans only.

Dick and the Chapter was concerned that the funds were only available to Post 9/11 Veterans and not Veterans from all wars. Dick worked with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles to get the funds directed to the Chapter instead of going to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund so the Indiana Chapters could provide assistance to Veterans from all wars.

In 2015, the Indiana Chapters started the Rolling Thunder® Indiana Veterans Relief Fund (RTIVF) with Dick as the Committee Chairman. From 2015 to 2018, the RTIVF program help a lot of Veterans that the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund was not able to help. In 2017, the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund changed their eligibility requirements that opened their funds to more Veterans from all wars. The RTIVF program ended in 2018 and the funds were turned back over to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund for distribution.

Since 2010 until December 2021, the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty plate has generated **\$1,061,850** to help our Indiana Veterans. Due to Dicks dedication and devotion to our POW/MIA mission and helping our Indiana Veterans, the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty plate has been a success and has helped a lot of Indiana Veterans in need that may not have received the assistance that they needed.

Dick was also our Master Builder of the platforms for our POW*MIA Chair of Honor displays. Dick built the platforms for the POW*MIA Chairs of Honor at the Lucas Oil Stadium, Indiana War Memorial, Indiana Farmers Coliseum, Indianapolis International Airport, Gainbridge Field House, Covington Court House, Indiana Military Veterans Hall of Fame, Grissom AFB Museum, Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery, and the Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Headquarters which was dedicated on December 22, 2021.

These POW*MIA Chairs of Honor will be on display for many years and will be seen by thousands of people each year. Dick will always be part of these special Chairs of Honor for those that are still listed as unaccounted-for.

There will be a Celebration of Life for Dick at the Fort Harrison Veterans Center on **Saturday May 14th**. After the Celebration of Life ceremony, we will escort Dick to his final resting place at the Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Madison Indiana where military honors will be conducted.

The Celebration of Life will be from 11:00 to 13:00 with the escort to the Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery departing at approximately 13:30.

Linda J. Smith-Cope Memorial Ride to the Wall

July 21-26, 2022



Linda was a member of Indiana Chapter One from 2006 to her unexpected passing in 2019. After returning home from the 2019 Ride for Freedom Demonstration, Linda went in for an outpatient surgery and developed a bacterial skin infection that rapidly spread through her entire body. She endured 2 post surgeries to reverse the infection, tons of antibiotics and a borage of other stuff to help save her life. The doctors were not able to stop the infection and she passed on June 11, 2019.

Linda is the sister of SFC Ronald Eugene Smith, which went missing in 1970 and still listed as one of our Indiana MIAs from the Vietnam War. Linda and her family has made several trips with the Chapter to Washington D.C to visit her Brother Ron who is listed on the Vietnam Memorial Wall.

Due to COVID concerns, the Chapter was not able to do a memorial ride for Linda in 2020 or 2021. We are hoping that COVID will not be a major concern this year. The memorial ride will include a visual at the Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington D.C, a visit to Gettysburg, PA and Flight 93 National Memorial in Shanksville, PA. Tuesday July 26th - Depart to Indianapolis, IN

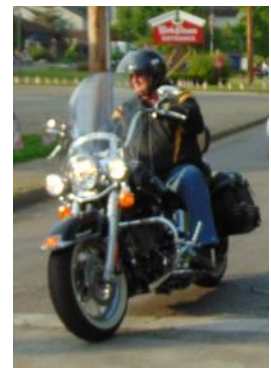

This gift is available to anyone that served between 1955 and 1975. You may also receive the gift for a family member that served and have passed on.



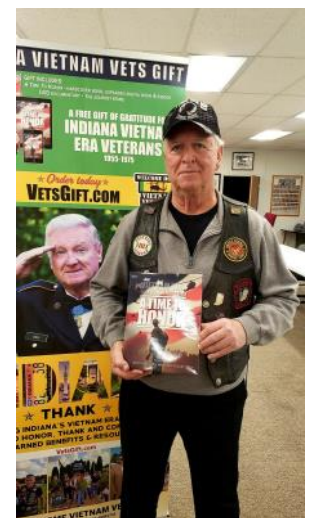

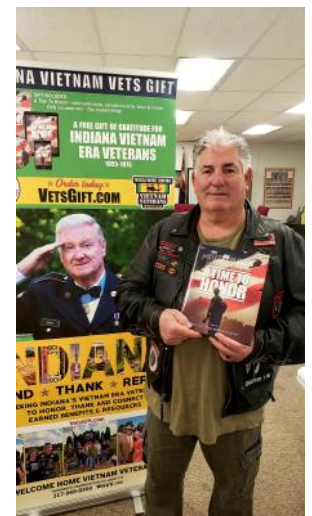

Lucy Higgs Nichols - Great but not forgotten story



The lady circled in red is Lucy Higgs Nichols. She was born into slavery in Tennessee.

During the Civil War she managed to escape and found her way to 23rd Indiana Infantry Regiment which was encamped nearby. She stayed with the regiment and worked as a nurse throughout the war. After the war, she moved north with the regiment and settled in Indiana, where she found work with some of the veterans of the 23rd.

She applied for a pension after Congress passed the Army Nurses Pension Act of 1892 which allowed Civil War nurses to draw pensions for their service. The War Department had no record of her, so her pension was denied. Fifty-five surviving veterans of the 23rd petitioned Congress for the pension they felt she had rightfully earned, and it was granted.

The photograph shows Nichols and other veterans of the Indiana regiment at a reunion in 1898.

She died in 1915 and is buried in a cemetery in New Albany, Indiana.

Lottie May Berry was born in Dunreith, Henry County, Indiana. She graduated from Deaconess Hospital, Indianapolis, Marion county, Indiana in 1913. She enlisted in the US Medical Corps in June, 1917, and was assigned to Base Hospital 32. She remained with this unit until her death on December 30, 1917 of pneumonia, at Naval Hospital 1 in France.

She was reported as the first American Red Cross Nurse to give her life on foreign soil.

Captain Lyon was a member of Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division. On February 5, 1970, he was the pilot of a Bell Iroquois Utility Helicopter (UH-1H) on a maintenance mission from Hue to Phu Bai, South Vietnam. When it was about 18 miles from Hue, the aircraft caught fire and crashed. Captain Lyon was taken prisoner and died in captivity. His remains were not recovered. .

Captain Lyon commendations included the following

Prisoner of War Medal, Purple Heart, Combat Infantryman Badge, Marksmanship Badge, Parachutist Badge, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Army Presidential Unit Citation, Vietnam Gallantry Cross, Army Good Conduct Medal.

Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations

National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rucker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. **A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.**



The Rucker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing, they will be issued the Eagle & Rucker patches, **which is the property of National.** **A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rucker and Eagle Patches.**

Membership Obligations

Retrieve Patches: It is the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not re-new dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. **The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.**

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package CERTIFIED or PRIORITY mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

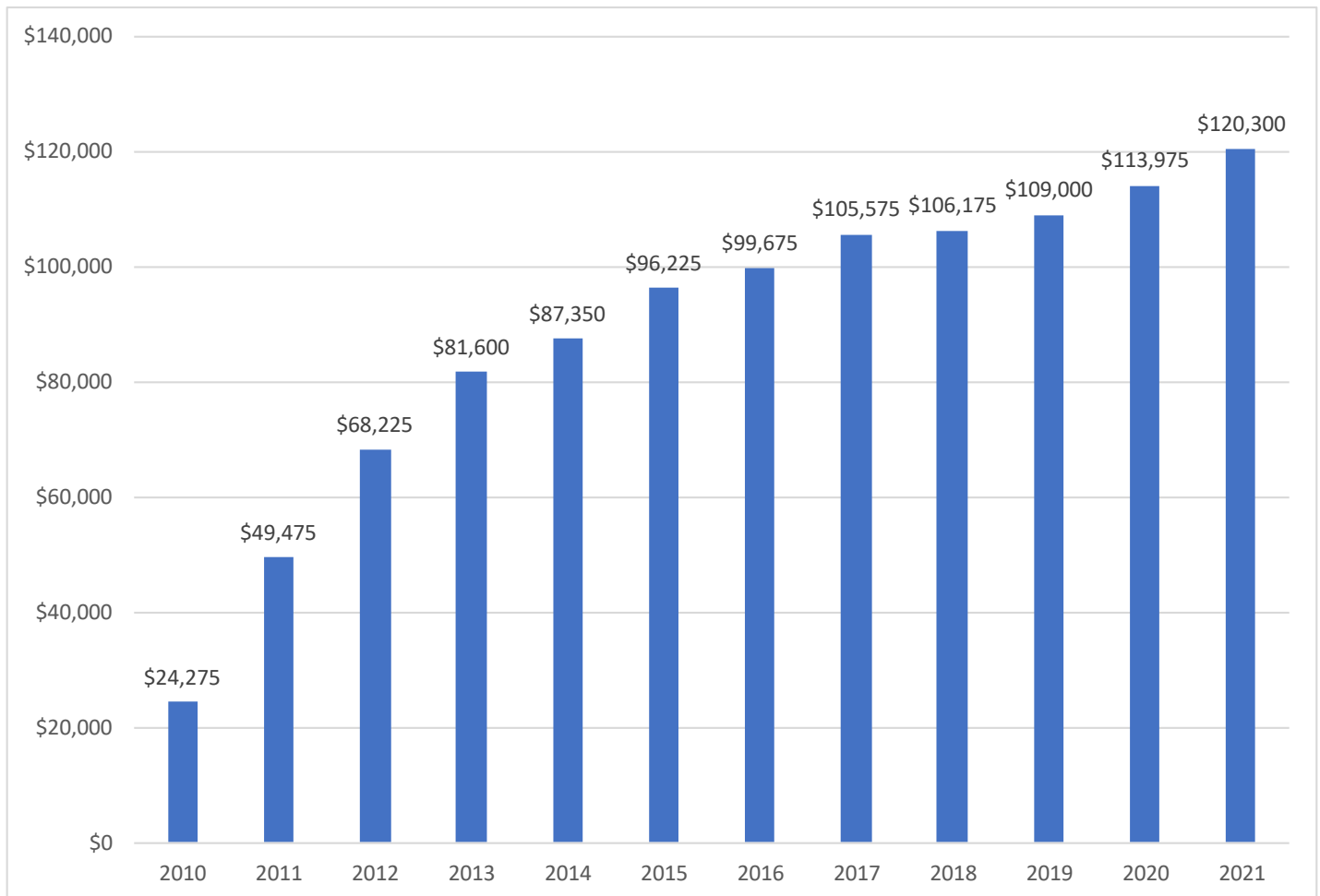

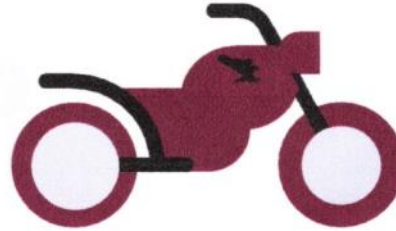
