Chapter Elections

The month of June is the start of the Chapters election process. In accordance with the National Constitution, all members will be duly notified of elections by an announcement at the June, July and August meeting. Listed below, and Pages 10-13 contain important information about the Chapter election process.

As a member of the Chapter, it is your duty to maintain your membership in good standing and participate in the Chapter election. **Nominations for the positions listed on page 9 will be taken at the July and August Chapter meetings only. You MUST be present to accept a nomination.** The Chapter election will be at the September 20, 2020 Chapter meeting.

- Only Rolling Thunder® members in good standing are eligible to vote.
- To be a member in good standing, you must have attended (3) Chapter meetings and (3) Chapter events with the membership year.
- Nominations will be taken at our July and August Chapter meetings only with the elections being held at our September 20th Chapter Meeting.
- The member being nominated must have attended six (6) Chapter meetings in the last twelve (12) months.
- Therefore, the nominee attendance requirement will be six (6) Chapter meetings and three (3) events within the membership year.
- The membership year is from September 1, 2019 to August 31, 2020.
- In accordance with Indiana Chapter #1, Chapter Rules, dated 19 January 2020, any member wishing to run for the office of President, or Chairman of the Board, must first have held another office, i.e.: Treasure, Secretary, or Board member, for a full term, with Indiana Chapter #1.
- Any qualified patch wearing (Rocker/Eagle) Chapter Member in good standing may run for the Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, or Board Member position.
- The election committee for the 2020 Chapter election will be announced at the July Chapter meeting.
- The election committee will be responsible for taking the nominations for officers, hand out, collect, and count the ballots after the election in September.



Vice President Duties and Responsibilities Description

The Chapter Vice President is an elected official with a (2) year term. The Chapter Vice President enhances the organization's public standing by clearly articulating the Rolling Thunder mission statement, accomplishments, and goals to the public and garners support from the community.

The duties of the Chapter Vice President will include, but not limited to the following duties:

- Reports to the Chapter President.
- Takes over the Chapter President's duties in his/her absence.
- Assist the Chapter President in the daily operation of the Chapter.
- Attend all monthly Chapter meetings.
- Assist the Chapter President to make sure all members follow the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution.
- Performs any other task assigned by the Chapter President.
- Manages new membership applications.
- Recommends programs to the Chapter Board, and membership on promoting new membership.
- Must not miss (3) consecutive meetings without legitimate excuse submitted to the Chapter President.
- Must abide by the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution Rules of Conduct at all times.
- Serves as a member on the Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter One Veterans Assistance Fund (RTIN1-VAF) Committee.

Chapter Treasurer Duties and Responsibilities Description

The Chapter Treasurer is an elected official with a (2) year term. He/she maintains custody of all the Chapter funds, and securities and will keep a full and accurate account of all receipts and disbursements in a ledger. The Chapter Treasurer enhances the organization's public standing by clearly articulating the Rolling Thunder® mission statement, accomplishments, and goals to the public and garners support from the community.

The duties of the Chapter Treasurer will include, but not limited to the following duties:

- Disbursement of the funds of the Chapter as directed by the Board of Director after approved by the Membership, and will comply with the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution.
- Maintains full accountability of all finances, to include the reconciliation of all Chapter bank accounts (General Operating Account, Gaming, and PayPal).
- Maintains comprehensive documented audit trail: receipts etc. of all accounts receivable and payable.
- Assist in the preparation of annual financial report.
- Provides monthly financial report to the Chapter.
- Collects and deposits annual membership dues, patch deposits, and other funds received by the Chapter.
- Prepare financial analytical reports as needed for the Officers and Board of Directors.
- Prepare an annual budget of revenues and expenses for Board of Directors and Membership approval.
- Prepare Federal and State tax returns.
- Obtain raffle licenses from the Gaming Commission and prepare event reports and annual reports. Prepare and submit lease contracts for events supporting raffle ticket sales.
- Must have business background and experience, and/or education in finance and accounting. Comfortable in the use of the computer for email, internet, and accounting software.
- Must abide by the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution Rules of Conduct at all times.
- Must not miss (3) consecutive meetings without legitimate excuse submitted to the Chapter President.

Chairman of the Board Duties and Responsibilities Description

The Chairman of the Board is an elected official with a (2) year term. The Chairman of the Board enhances the organization's public standing by clearly articulating the Rolling Thunder® mission statement, accomplishments, and goals to the public and garners support from the community.

The duties of the Chapter COB will include, but not limited to the following duties:

- Runs the Board meeting and ensures they are run by the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution and Roberts rules when applicable.
- He/she is the deciding vote should there be a deadlock on the tabled issues.
- Responsible to the President of the Chapter or Vice President if filling in for the President.
- Prepares agenda for each scheduled Board meeting and ensures that the agenda is followed by the Board members.
- Must not miss (3) consecutive meetings without legitimate excuse submitted to the Chapter President.
- Must have held another office, i.e.: Treasure, Secretary, or Board member, for a full term with Indiana Chapter #1.
- Must abide by the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution Rules of Conduct at all times.
- Serves as a member on the Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter One Veterans Assistance Fund (RTIN1-VAF) Committee.

- Must attend all scheduled Board meetings and special Board meetings as determined by the Chairman of the Board or Chapter President.
- Must not miss (3) consecutive meetings without legitimate excuse submitted to the Chairman of the Board or Chapter President.
- Makes recommendations to the Board that will help promote the Chapter's mission and goals.
- Participates in Board discussions as presented by the Chairman of the Board or other Board Members.
- Votes on subject maters as directed by the Chairman of the Board.
- Must abide by the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution Rules of Conduct at all times.
- Have a working knowledge of the National Constitution and Chapter Rules found on the Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter 1 website.
- Serves as a member on the Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter One Veterans Assistance Fund (RTIN1-VAF) Committee.

WWII MIA Marine Corps Reserve PFC Charles D. Miller, 19 Albany Indiana was accounted for on May 19, 2020



Private First Class Charles Donald Miller, who entered the U.S. Marine Corps from Indiana, served with Company A, 1st Battalion, 6th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division. He was killed in action during the Battle of Tarawa on November 22, 1943. He was buried on Betio Island, but subsequent investigations could not identify his remains among those recovered from the Betio burial sites. Today, Private First Class Miller is memorialized on the Courts of the Missing at the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific. On January 22, 2014, Jennifer Morrison, Chair of the Rolling Thunder Indiana Chapter 1 Family Reference Sample (FRS) Committee, found the family of PFC Miller and put them in contact with the Marine Corps POW/MIA Section. This reestablished lines of communication with Satchy's family regarding the ongoing recovery and repatriation efforts, and offered his cousin the opportunity to provide a Family Reference DNA Sample, should it be necessary for PFC Miller's identification. Thanks to the efforts of Jennifer and DPAA, the Miller Family can finally have closer.

The funeral services for PFC Miller has not been set, but will be buried in the Arlington National Cemetery.

Marine PFC Louis Wiesehan Richmond Indiana ID: September 23, 2019



PFC Wiesehan who was accounted for on September 23, 2019 was scheduled to come home on June 11th, 2020. However, the Wiesehan family rescheduled his return for **Thursday September 17, 2020**. The Chapter will join the Indiana Patriot Guard in escorting PFC Wiesehan from the Indianapolis airport to Richmond Indiana when he arrives. The date for PFC Wiesehan funeral services will be announced when known. PFC Wiesehan will be buried at the Goshen Cemetery in Richmond, Indiana.



Marine PVT William Rambo LaPorte Indiana ID: July 13, 2019

PVT Rambo's family has decided to postpone his 7/20 services at Arlington National Cemetery. This is due to the current political climate, as well as the ongoing pandemic. It may be well into 2021 before PVT Rambo is finally laid to rest in American soil




Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plates As of May 31, 2020



As of May 31, 2020 we have **4,233** POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. The funds generated from the sale of the POW/MIA Specialty plate goes towards helping our Indiana Veterans in need through the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF).

The June 2020 license plate sales have not received as of the publishing of this newsletter and will be announced at the July Chapter meeting.

Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate Fund From 2010 to 2020



Since the introduction of the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate in January 2010, the plate has generated an estimated **\$871,450**. The June plate sales have not been received as of the publishing of this newsletter and will be announced at the July Chapter meeting.

100% of the proceeds generated from the sales of the POW/MIA specialty plate goes to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF) to help our Indiana Veterans in need.

Indiana House Bill: HB1086

Bill Details:

Reservist tuition supplement program. Establishes the reservist tuition supplement program (program) and reservist tuition supplement program fund (fund). Requires the commission for higher education to administer the program and fund. Provides that money in the fund is continually appropriated.

Our first COH was installed at the Lucas Oil Stadium on November 2, 2014 and the latest one at the Plainfield High School on September 19, 2019.

These special chairs will remind thousands of people of the men that fought for our freedom and still need to come home, live or dead.

The placement of these special chairs in High Schools is specialty important to remind the younger generations of the cost of war and the price of freedom.


