Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter 1 Elections

The June Chapter meeting was the start of our 2023 election cycle.

In accordance with the National Constitution, all members will be duly notified of elections by an announcement at the June, July and August Chapter meeting. **Nominations will be taken at our July and August Chapter meetings only.** You MUST be present to accept the Nomination.

To be nominated and/or elected for any officer position, a member must be in good standing for a period of (1) year or longer.

The member must have their Rocker/Eagle patches and have attended six (6) Chapter meetings in the past (12) months prior to nomination.

The election will be held at our September 17th Chapter Meeting.

The positions that will be up for election is the President, Secretary, (3) Board Members, and Alternate Board Member.

In accordance with the National Constitution, to be eligible for position of Chapter President, a member must have held a Chapter Executive Officer position or been a member of the Board of Directors for 12 months of a Chapter prior to being nominated. Under special circumstances a waiver may be granted by National.

In accordance with Chapter Rules Version 1.2, Any Chapter member in good standing wishing to run for the office of President, or Chairman of the Board, must first have held another office, i.e.: Treasurer, Secretary, or Board member, for a full term with RTIN Chapter #1.

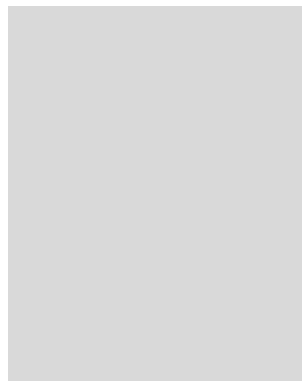

The 35th Ride for Freedom is in the books. This year, we rode to the Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum in Fort Wayne Indiana. The staff at the memorial provided outstanding support to the Chapter and we really appreciated their support. They have a great facility.

We started out with registration at the Fort Harrison Veterans Center and rode to the Fort Wayne Harley Davidson shop to pickup the Fort Wayne riders that registered at the shop on the morning of the event. We had a total of **61** that registered at the Fort Harrison Veterans Center and **23** that registered at the Fort Wayne Harley Davidson shop. Out of the **84** that registered, **32** were FNG's.

The Lawrence Police Department did an outstanding job escorting the group from the Veterans Center through Lawrence to IN-234 where we continued our travels to Fort Wayne. Once we arrived at the Fort Wayne Harley Davidson shop, we were met by the Allen County Sheriff Department who escorted the group over to the Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum.

Upon arrival at the Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum we started our program. The program started out with the Marine CORP League Detachment #1435 Color Guard presenting the National Colors and Lisa McDavid signing the National Anthem. Ms. McDavid did an outstanding job with the National Anthem.

The Chapter President gave some opening remarks followed by a Wreath Laying ceremony to honor those who lost their lives during WWI, WWII, Korean War, Vietnam War and the Global War on Terrorism. Chapter members read the names of the Service Members from WWII and the Korean War that are still missing from Allen County. Allen County currently has 40 MIAs from WWII and 10 from the Koreans War.

The Chapter performed the Roll Call ceremony for the 51 Vietnam War MIAs from Indiana. Before the Roll Call ceremony, the Chapter President mentioned the number of Indiana heroes listed on the Wall to include CPT Mary T. Klinker, United States Airforce who is one of eight females listed on the wall. During the Roll Call ceremony, Captain Phillip Alan Ducat's name was called and his Biograph was read by the Chapter President. Captain Phillip Alan Ducat is the only Vietnam War MIA from Allen County.

After the Roll Call ceremony for our Vietnam War MIAs, the Chapter Honor Guard laid the wreath for the Global War on Terrorism. The Chapter President mentioned the number of Americans that served during Global War on Terrorism and the number American Casualties to include nine from Allen County. The names of the nine Service Members from Allen County were read.

As a tribute to the brave men and women who gave their lives for the freedoms that we enjoy today, the American Legion Post 241 fired a three Volley salute followed by TAPS.

At the end of the program, Robert Thomas of the Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum gave a briefing on the facility. The Chapter President acknowledged the people and organization that helped to make the Ride for Freedom a successful event. Following the program, the Chapter Cooks prepared a nice lunch for the group.

The group had a opportunity to tour the grounds and the new war history museum that just opened on Saturday May 27th.

If you want to know what the term FNG means, ask a Vietnam War Veteran.

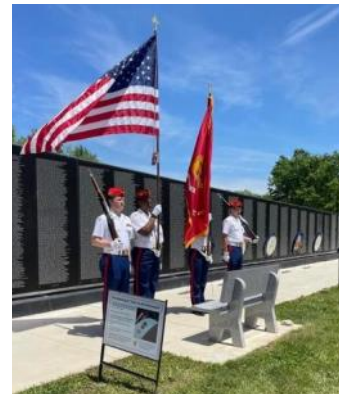

The ceremony simulates a squad leader reporting the whereabouts of their squad members to the platoon sergeant during a morning roll call.

When the Chapter rode to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington DC, we laid a wreath at the wall and placed Dog Tags on the wreath of our 50 Indiana MIAs.

Dog Tags were given to the participants that registered in Indianapolis. When the name of the MIA was called, the individual with the Dog Tag for the MIA would step forward and place the Dog Tag on the Vietnam Wreath. The Dog Tags for all 50 of the MIAs from Indiana were placed on the wreath.

The Dog Tag for George C. Miller who is the only Indiana Civilian missing from the Vietnam War was also placed on the wreath.

PO2 Russell Williams Escort June 8, 2023



Russell Lawrence “Bowser” Williams, 28, of Norfolk, VA, and formerly of Frankfort, Ind., died May 25, 2023. He was born March 12, 1995 in Whidbey Island Naval Air Station in Oak Harbor, Washington to Thomas Clifford & Nora “Sam” (Chapman) Williams-Wyant. Russell was a 2014 graduate of Frankfort High School and attended Ivy Tech. He was on active duty with the U.S. Navy as a 2nd Class Petty Officer. He was a GSM2 Mechanic, gas turbine technician mechanical second class. He received his orders in January to the USS Delbert D. Black an escort carrier. He was a member of the Forgotten Soulz RC in Norfolk, VA. Russell enjoyed the demolition derby, working on cars and motorcycles, riding his motorcycle and loved spending time with his family and friends.

Russell is survived by his Father: Thomas Clifford Williams of Colfax, formerly Frankfort, Mother: Nora “Sam” Williams-Wyant of Ferndale, WA, Paternal Grandparents: Russell & Jackie Williams, Uncles: James Williams, Charles Allen, Joe (Deanna) Williams, Howie Williams, Ray (Nancy) Chapman and Rick (Lynette) Chapman, several cousins and friends also survive. He is preceded in death by his uncle, Bob Williams and maternal grandparents, Lawrence W. & Arcadia R. Chapman.

WWII MIA IDENTIFIED PFC Leonard Adams, Dana Indiana



PFC Leonard E. Adams, 25, a courageous, selfless, individual, was born Saturday, Jan. 3, 1920, and sadly passed away on Sunday, Jan. 21, 1945, in the vicinity of Reipertswiller, France while fighting for his country during World War II.

In the early years of World War II, Leonard joined the U.S. Army and became a member of the 3rd Battalion, 157th Infantry Regiment. As a private first class, he bravely served his country and fought against German forces near Reipertswiller, France. Tragically, Leonard was reported missing in action on Jan. 21, 1945, but was never reported as a prisoner of war. It was later determined he was killed in action, making the ultimate sacrifice for his country and the freedom of others.

Seventy-eight years after his death, Leonard's remains have been found and positively identified through DNA testing. This discovery brings closure to a long and difficult journey for those who have sought answers about Leonard's fate. It also allows this remarkable man to receive the respect and gratitude he so rightfully deserves. Leonard's legacy will be remembered as one of unwavering courage, boundless passion, and selfless dedication to the cause of freedom.

Leonard was survived by his wife, Suzanne Adams, who has since passed away along with all his other immediate family members. Although they are no longer here to witness the recognition of Leonard's sacrifice, his unwavering dedication to his country will never be forgotten.

A graveside with full military honors for PFC Leonard Adams was on Friday, June 23, at the Kentucky Veterans Cemetery-Central in Radcliff.

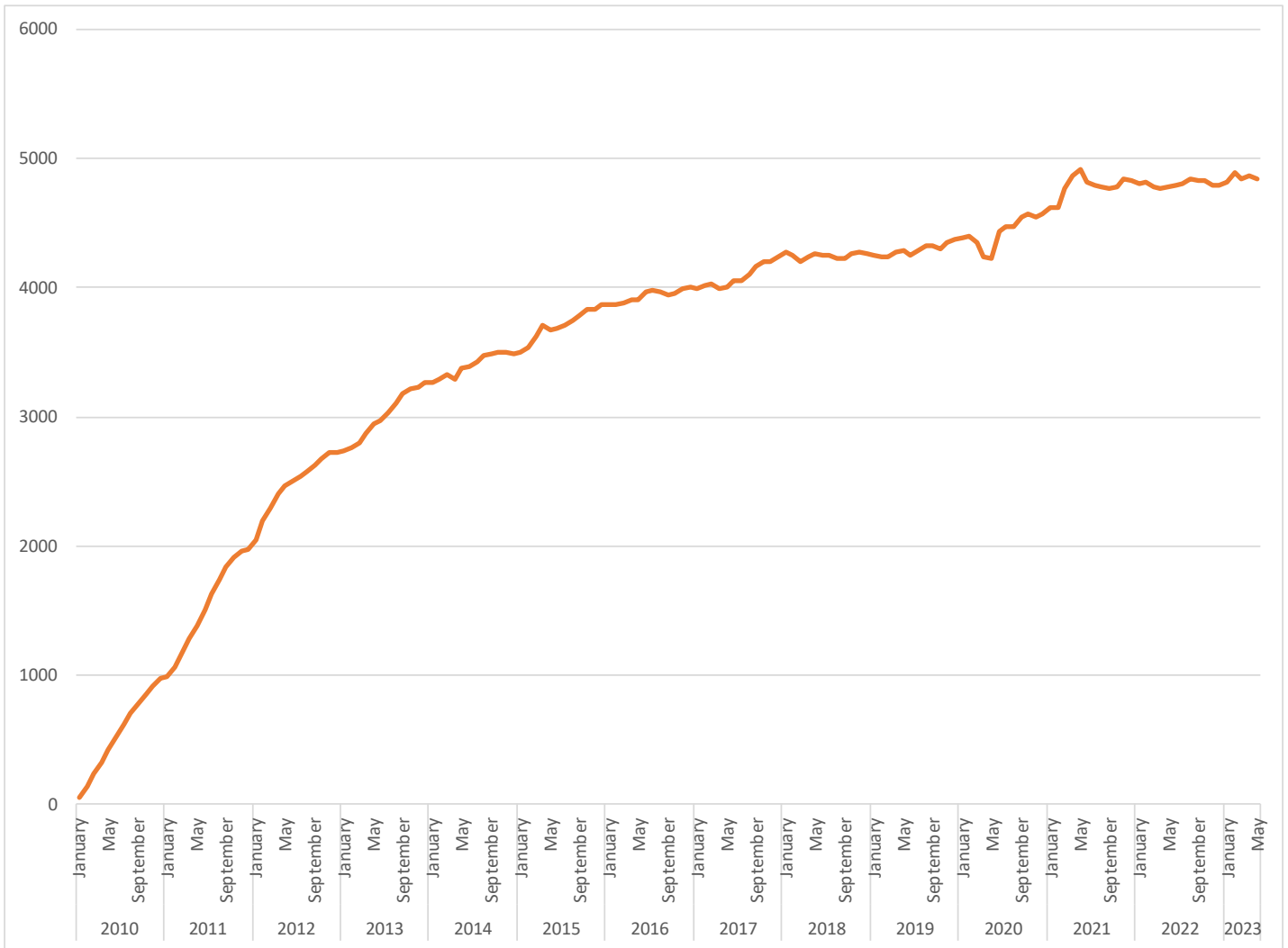

Everyone is encouraged to attend this special ceremony on Sunday July 30th at the USS Indianapolis Memorial.

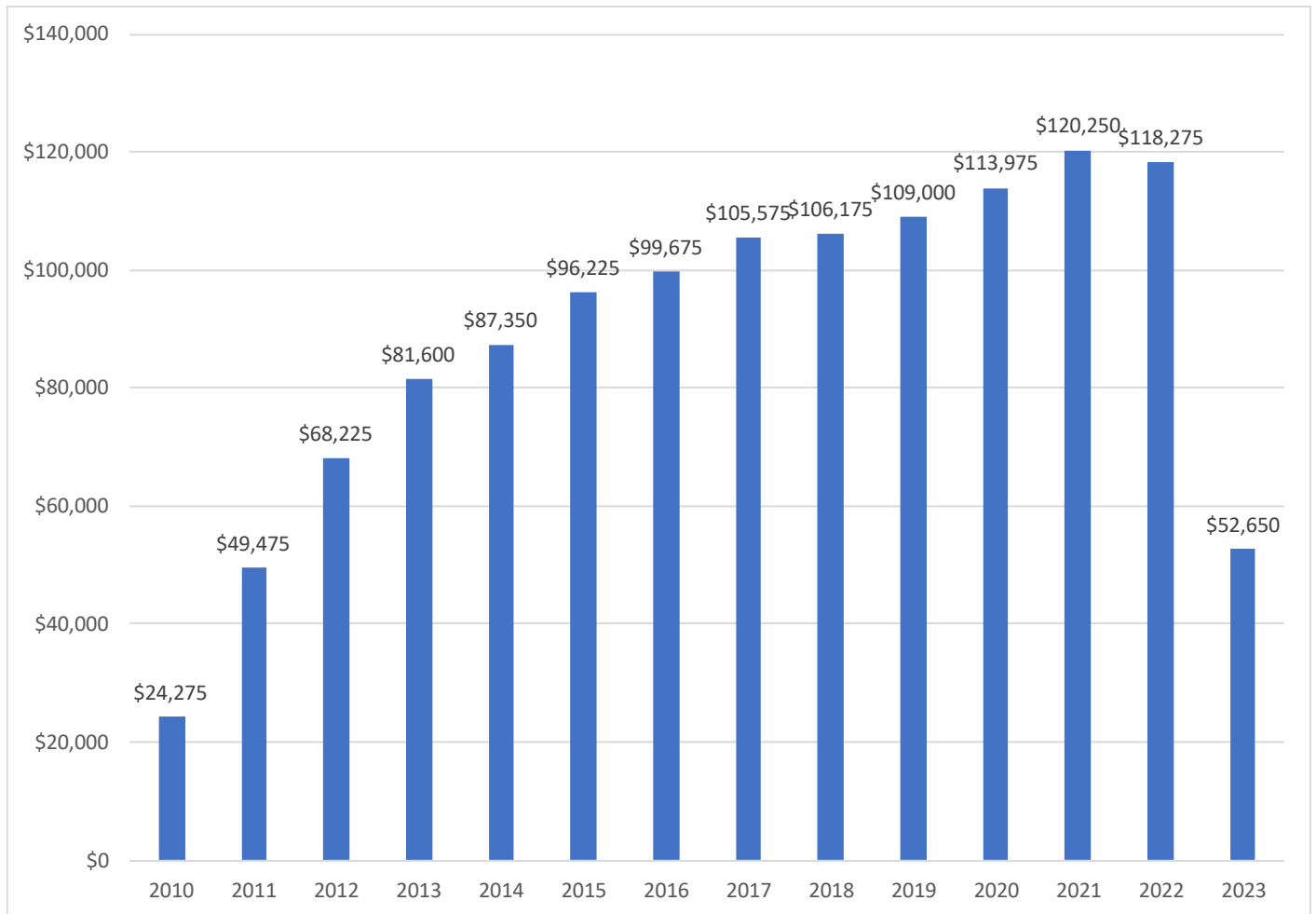
Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plates on the Streets



As of April 2023, we have **4,840** POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. The funds generated from the sale of the POW/MIA Specialty plate goes towards helping our Indiana Veterans in need through the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF). **We are 55 plates up from this time last year.**

Since the introduction of the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate in January 2010, the plate has generated an estimated **\$1,232,725** 100% of the proceeds generated from the sales of the POW/MIA specialty plate goes to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF) to help our Indiana Veterans in need.

With the purchase of a Indiana POW/MIA specialty plate, not only will you be instrumental in helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs and MIAs, you will be helping our Indiana Veterans in need.

Rolling Thunder® , Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations

National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rocker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. **A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.**

The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing ,they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, **which is the property of National.** **A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.**

Membership Obligations

Retrieve Patches: It's the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not renew dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. **The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.**

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package CERTIFIED or PRIORITY mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

Please DO NOT Glue your patches on your vest. National will NOT accept damaged patches and you may lose your patch refund.
