Marine PFC Louis Wiesehan WWII MIA



The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced today that Marine Corps Pfc. Louis Wiesehan, Jr., 20, of Richmond, Indiana, killed during World War II, was accounted for on Sep. 23, 2019.

In November 1943, Wiesehan was a member of Company F, 2nd Battalion, 8th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division, which landed against stiff Japanese resistance on the small island of Betio in the Tarawa Atoll of the Gilbert Islands in an attempt to secure the island. Over several days of intense fighting at Tarawa, approximately 1,000 Marines and Sailors were killed and more than 2,000 were wounded, while the Japanese were virtually annihilated. Wiesehan was killed on the second day of the battle, Nov. 21, 1943. His remains were reportedly buried in Division Cemetery on Betio Island.

In 1946, the 604th Quartermaster Graves Registration Company centralized all of the American remains found on Tarawa at Lone Palm Cemetery for later repatriation; however, almost half of the known casualties were never found. No recovered remains could be associated with Wiesehan, and in October 1949, a Board of Review declared him "non-recoverable."

In 2014, History Flight, Inc., a nonprofit organization, located Cemetery 27. Excavations of the site uncovered multiple sets of remains, which were turned over to DPAA in 2015.

To identify Wiesehan's remains, scientists from DPAA used anthropological analysis, as well as material evidence. Additionally, scientists from the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System used mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) analysis. Wiesehan's name is recorded on the Courts of the Missing at the Punchbowl, along with the others killed or lost in WWII. A rosette will be placed next to his name to indicate he has been accounted for.

Wiesehan will be buried April 18, 2020, in his hometown of Richmond Indiana. Please mark April 18, 2020 down on your calendar and plan on attending.

Young, Pence Introduce Resolution to Honor 75th Anniversary of Iwo Jima February 21, 2020

WASHINGTON – U.S. Senator Todd Young (R-Ind.) and Representative Greg Pence (IN-06) today introduced a Joint Resolution to honor the 75th Anniversary of the Battle for Iwo Jima during World War II. The <u>resolution</u> recognizes the bravery and heroism demonstrated 75 years ago during the victory that was led by the United States Marine Corps on the island of Iwo Jima.

Next month, Senator Young and Congressman Pence will participate in a congressional delegation to Iwo Jima, now known as Iwo-To, to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the Battle of Iwo Jima.

"Iwo Jima is hallowed ground for me, my fellow Marines, and all those who lost loved ones in the battle. This resolution helps to recognize those who gave their lives in Iwo Jima seventy-five years ago," **said Senator Young.** "The resolution also calls upon Americans to honor these veterans and reaffirm the deep bonds of friendship between the United States and Japan that have developed over the seventy-five years since we were at war."


"As a Beirut Veteran, I understand that our first duty is to remember. The 75th anniversary of the Battle for Iwo Jima is a time to remember and honor the relentless courage of our men and women in uniform. Our Marines took Iwo Jima at a heavy cost, but their bravery made possible the Allied Victory in World War II. It is one of the deadliest days in Marine Corps history, and those heroes will never be forgotten," **said Congressman Pence.** "I had the solemn experience of going to Iwo Jima when I was deployed as a Marine. I am honored to return this year with the Commandant of the Marine Corps to remember the nearly 7,000 Marines who made the ultimate sacrifice at the Battle for Iwo Jima."


Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plates on the Streets As of February 29, 2020



As of February 29, 2020 we have 4,395 POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. In addition, the funds generated from the sale of the POW/MIA Specialty plate goes towards helping our Indiana Veterans in need through the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF).

On a year to date basis as compared to the same period last year, we are up 23 plates or 4.3%. Let's keep up the great work.

Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate Fund From 2010 to 2020



Since the introduction of the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate in January 2010, the plate has generated an estimated \$841,625 with 2019 being a record year of \$109,000.

100% of the proceeds generated from the sales of the POW/MIA specialty plate goes to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF) to help our Indiana Veterans in need.

Reservist tuition supplement program. Establishes the reservist tuition supplement program (program) and reservist tuition supplement program fund (fund). Requires the commission for higher education to administer the program and fund. Provides that money in the fund is continually appropriated.




For over 22 years, our Chapter has ridden to Washington D.C to participate in the Rolling Thunder®, Inc. National Ride for Freedom demonstrations.

To date, we have (12) POW*MIA Chairs of Honor installed in venues throughout Indiana. Our first COH was installed at the Lucas Oil Stadium on November 2, 2014 and the latest one at the Plainfield High School on September 19, 2019.

These special chairs will remind thousands of people of the men that fought for our freedom and still need to come home, live or dead.

The placement of these special chairs in High Schools is specialty important to remind the younger generations of the cost of war and the price of freedom.


