On February 25, 2021 the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced the identification of CPO James B. Booe 42, of Veedersburg, Indiana. On Dec. 7, 1941, Booe was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which was moored at Ford Island, Pearl Harbor, when the ship was attacked by Japanese aircraft. The USS Oklahoma sustained multiple torpedo hits, which caused it to quickly capsize. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen, including Booe. Booe will be buried on June 1, 2021, at the Punchbowl in Honolulu, HI. Indiana still has 1,505 heroes unaccounted for from WWII.







The Chapter gives back to our younger generations by offering two different scholarship opportunities.

The **Linda Smith-Cope scholarship** was created in honor of Linda Cope who unexpectedly passed away in 2019. Linda was a member of the Chapter and sister of Ronald E. Smith who is one of our Indiana MIAs from the Vietnam War. Linda went to High School in Covington Indiana, so the scholarship is only offered to Covington High School students.

The **Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter #1 Scholarship** was created for family members of our Indiana Former Prisoners of War (POW) and those that are still Missing in Action (MIA). The Chapter believes its important to give back to the family members that have suffered from their loved one being in captivity and those that still don't know the whereabouts of their loved one.

Linda Smith-Cope Scholarship

This scholarship is to honor Linda's spirit, and not only remember her brother Ronald E. Smith but all those that have yet to come home to family and friends from all past wars. A \$1,000 scholarship is to be awarded annually (2021 to 2022) to a Covington Community High School, Covington, Indiana graduating senior seeking a higher education at an accredited College, University, or Trade School.



An Enormous Crime By Bill Hendon and Elizabeth A. Stewart

August 2018 I was in the parking lot of the Veterans Center when a jogger came by and stopped to talk to me. He had been a clinical professor with IU, IUPUI and lobbyist for the Indiana Urban Schools Association. After I told him about my association with Rolling Thunder, he asked if I had read <u>An Enormous Crime</u>. I said I had not. With his suggestion I immediately ordered the book on Amazon. Of the six books in the recommended reading list mentioned in our chapter newsletter, this book is the most comprehensive discussion of the POW issue and a *must read*.

<u>An Enormous Crime</u> is an unabridged discussion of the POW issue. The book is the product of 25 years of research. From the 1961 Bay of Pigs' prisoner release and indemnification to Cuba for damages from which North Vietnam was most likely schooled in future negotiations with the United States, to Nixon's broken promises, to Ross Perot going to Hanoi, to 2005. Any stories you have heard about of people or sightings, or of former POWs and operation homecoming will be fully discussed. The book is a chronology, year by year, of events.



The author Bill Hendon, former U.S. Representative (R-NC) fought endlessly for the full accounting of our MIAs from Vietnam during his terms in office. In the Halls of Congress Bill was known as the 'POW/MIA Activist'. Bill Hendon passed away in June 2018. Coauthor is attorney Elizabeth A. Stewart whose father is Col. Peter J. Stewart, USAF, MIA March 15, 1966, a decorated combat veteran of WWII and Vietnam.

QUARTERMASTER CALL "Supporting the Victory"

New from the Quartermaster just in time for the riding season.

We have a first aid kit especially designed for the biker. The content has been recommended by our own Tony Palmeiro who is qualified in matters of emergency medical care. Then along with Fieldtex Products, the first aid supply superstore, we came up with this custom first aid kit.

The typical first aid needs a biker may have is to treat minor scratches, scraps, and abrasions, burns from the wind, sun, and heat from the engine and pipes. Also, foreign particles that may find their way into your eyes. Then there are stinging bugs and biting insects whether you encounter them on the road or off the road if you wonder too deep into the weeds at some scenic overlook or just taking care of business. And, then we have poison ivy and oak to deal with.

We got you covered on all of these things plus, much more. A quick walk through the inventory you will find:

For a starter you have a first aid booklet, then an assortment of band aids, ³/₄ by 3" common size band aid, larger 2" by 4" band aid, knuckle, butterfly, and fingertip band aids,

Next are alcohol wipes, antiseptic towelettes, and hand sanitizer packets,

Next are cortisone cream packets, antibiotic ointment packets, burn gel packets, and a 4" by 4" burn dressing.

Then eye pads and eye wash,

And, for the critters: bug sting and bite pads, and mosquito protection,

Then sunscreen protection and treatment, and a poison ivy, oak towelette.

2 tablet packet assortment for hay fever, headaches, cramps, upset stomach, diarrhea, and dehydration.

Last but not least, is a cold pack, a survival rescue, 52" by 84", blanket in the event you need protection from the cold, a tourniquet, wire scissors, tweezers, 2 pairs vinyl gloves, and a 12 hour break and glow light stick for drawing attention and safety.

All of this comes in a nifty plastic pack that will easily fit into the tour pack or saddle bag.

Indiana WWII MIA Accounted for Navy Bandmaster James B. Booe



The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced today that Navy Bandmaster James B. Booe, 42, of **Veedersburg, Indiana**, killed during World War II, was accounted for on Sept. 29, 2020.

On Dec. 7, 1941, Booe was assigned to the battleship USS Oklahoma, which was moored at Ford Island, Pearl Harbor, when the ship was attacked by Japanese aircraft. The USS Oklahoma sustained multiple torpedo hits, which caused it to quickly capsize. The attack on the ship resulted in the deaths of 429 crewmen, including Booe.

To identify Booe's remains, scientists from DPAA used dental and anthropological analysis. Additionally, scientists from the Armed Forces Medical Examiner System used Y chromosome DNA (Y-STR) analysis.

Booe's name is recorded on the Walls of the Missing at the Punchbowl, along with the others who are missing from WWII. A rosette will be placed next to his name to indicate he has been accounted for.

Booe will be buried on June 1, 2021, at the Punchbowl in Honolulu, HI

Indiana still has 1,505 MIAs from WWII, 172 from the Korean War, and 51 from the Vietnam War.

Sunday August 29th – **Veterans Center Support Ride**: Greg Thompson and Vern Rensing are working on the details for the event.

Saturday Sep 18th – **Indianapolis POW/MIA Recognition Day Ride and Ceremony**: On Friday March 5th, the POW/MIA Council approved the POW/MIA Recognition Day Ceremony to be done on Saturday and Rolling Thunder® to coordinate the escort ride for our Former POWs and MIA family members. This will be our premier event for the year and hope we have maximum participation from the membership.


Ride to the Wall - Washington DC, Gettysburg, and Flight 93 National Memorial, Shanksville, PA. The committee discussed the COVID restrictions for Washington DC and Pennsylvania, and based on the COVID restrictions in both States, traveling to Washington DC and Flight 93 National Memorial in 2021 is not recommended.

National Prisoner of War Museum, Andersonville, GA: The Visitor Center and museum is closed due to COVID and may remain closed until October 2021 time frame. The cemetery with a self guided tour is open to the public. The committee recommended to put this ride on hold until we know the Visitor Center and museum are open.

Fund Raising Events: Our event calendar doesn't have any fund raising events for the Chapter. The only fund raising event we have on the 2021 calendar is for the Veterans Center. We need to come up with some fund raising events to generate revenue or find more sponsors. Some events that were discussed included: **Poker Run** (The last Poker Run we had was 2009), **Scavenger Hunt** (The last Scavenger Hunt was in 2010), **Gun Raffle**, **Spaghetti Dinner**, **Fish Fry** and **Pancake Breakfast**. The committee didn't make a decision on a particular fund raising event and would like to have input from the membership.

Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plates As of February 28, 2021




