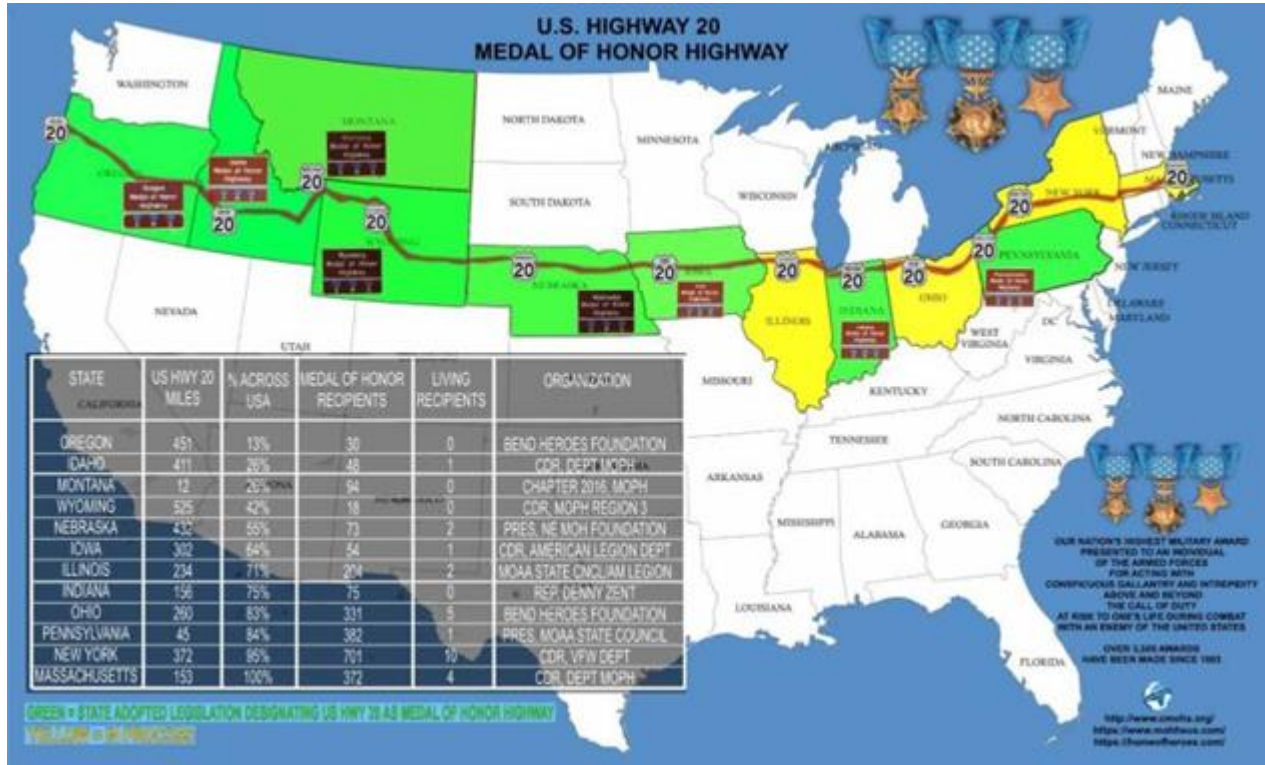

POW/MIA Medal

National Medal of Honor Highway



On December 17, 2024 U.S. Highway 20 officially became the “**National Medal of Honor Highway**”. U.S. Highway 20 is the longest continuous highway in the United States and will now honor all current and future Medal of Honor recipients, the nation’s highest military award for valor. All 12 states along U.S. Highway 20 have designated their state’s Medal of Honor Highways covering 100 percent of the 3,365-mile Medal of Honor Highway across America.

Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) WWII MIA Charles W. Smalley JR

On January 14, 2025 the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) has announced the identification of WWII MIA Charles W. Smalley JR from Porter County Indiana. PVT Smalley entered the U.S. Army from Indiana and served in Company L, 3rd Battalion, 141st Infantry Regiment, 36th Infantry Division.

PVT Smalley is believed to be from **Chesterton Indiana**. DPAA has not indicated the funeral arrangements for PVT Smalley. Additional research has indicated that the family of PVT Smalley has placed a Flat Bronze Marker in the Chesterton cemetery in 1975. More detail information will be provided on PVT Smalley when received.

PVT CHARLES W SMALLEY JR BIO

Smalley entered the U.S. Army from Indiana and served in Company L, 3rd Battalion, 141st Infantry Regiment, 36th Infantry Division. After the successful “D-Day” landings on the Normandy beaches, Allied commanders implemented a plan for an invasion in southern France, code-named Operation DRAGOON. On August 25, Smalley’s unit’s objective was to repel German forces from a mountain between Marsanne and the village of La Coucourde. An eyewitness reported that he was killed by machine gun fire during the first 10 minutes of the attack. In 1946, the American Graves Registration Command, the organization that searched for and recovered fallen American personnel in the European Theater, searched the Marsanne and La Coucourde area for Smalley and others still unaccounted-for from the attack, but did not uncover any leads. On April 16, 1951, Smalley was declared non-recoverable. On September 6, 1944, members of the 46th Quartermaster Graves Registration Company had unearthed a set of unidentified remains from a secluded grave located on a wooded ridge north of Montélimar, France. The remains had been taken to a temporary U.S. Military Cemetery in Montélimar and relocated to the USMC Luynes near Marseille, France in November 1945. Efforts to identify the remains were unsuccessful and they were buried as an Unknown. In March 2023, based on on-going research by DPAA historians focused on soldiers missing from Operation DRAGOON and the campaign in southern France, this Unknown was exhumed and transferred to the DPAA Laboratory for further study. The laboratory analysis and the totality of the circumstantial evidence available established an association between the unknown remains and Smalley.

The Chapter will have a booth at the Indy 1500 Gun and Blade show to meet new people and bring more awareness to the public about our POWs/MIAs, and our Mission. We will also raffle off two weapons to help generate additional operating funds for the Chapter. The first show is March 7-9th and the final show for the Chapter will be June 6th through 8th. The drawing for the weapons will be on June 8th.

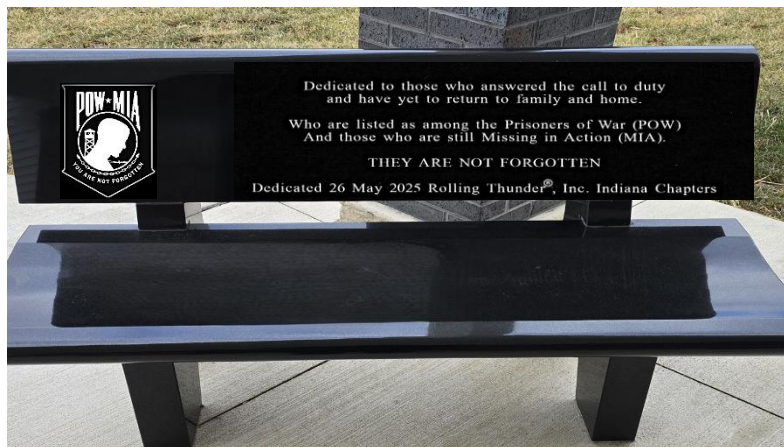
Rolling Thunder® XXXVII Ride for Freedom May 26, 2025

The 37th annual Ride for Freedom for Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Indiana Chapter #1 will be on Monday May 26th. The event will start at the Fort Harrison Veterans Center located at 9450 East 59th Street Indianapolis, IN 46226 and will end up at the Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum located at 2122 O'Day Rd, Fort Wayne, IN 46818. The details for the 37th annual Ride for Freedom will be located on our website at www.indianarollingthunder.com.

The Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum has a ¾ replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memoria Wall like the one in Washington DC. They also have a Korean War Memorial that was dedicated in 2024. The Korean War Memorial is similar to the one in Washington DC with the exception that the faces on the on the Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum Korean War Memorial are ones from Allen County.

They have the Merci 40 & 8 Box Car given to Indiana by the French Government in 1949 after World War II. The Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum dedicated Global War on Terror Memorial this past June which Honors all those Gold Star family members killed in combat. New monuments scheduled to be dedicated in 2025 are a World War I Monument; a World War II monument and the Global War on terrorism monuments made of Indiana limestone.

Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Indiana Chapter #1 will dedicate a POW/MIA Bench at the Veterans National Memorial Shrine and Museum on May 26th as part of the event. The bench is to honor those who answered the call to duty and have yet to return to family and home, or Prisoner of War (POW) and those that are still Missing in Action (MIA). The wording on the bench will be as stated below the bench.



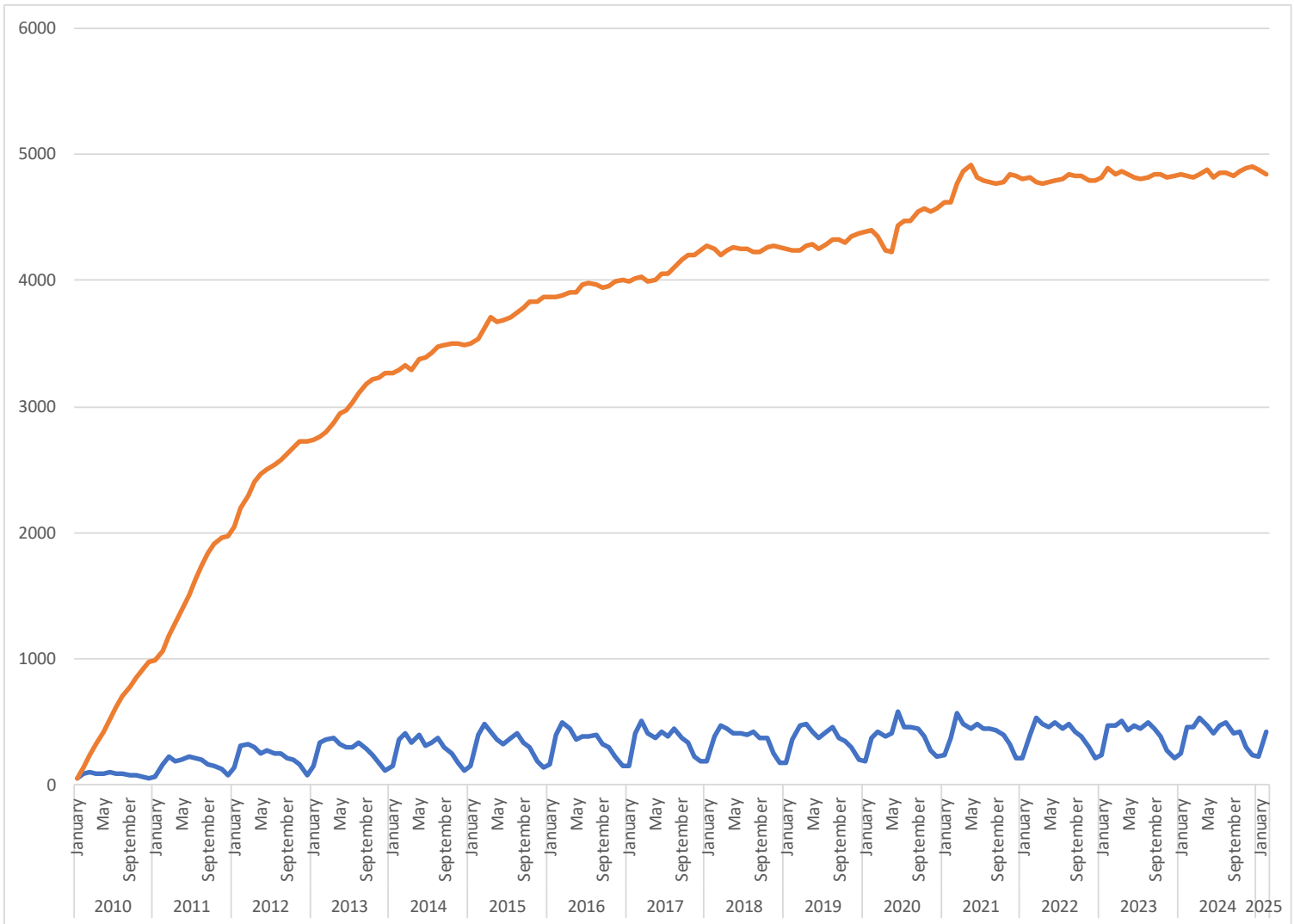

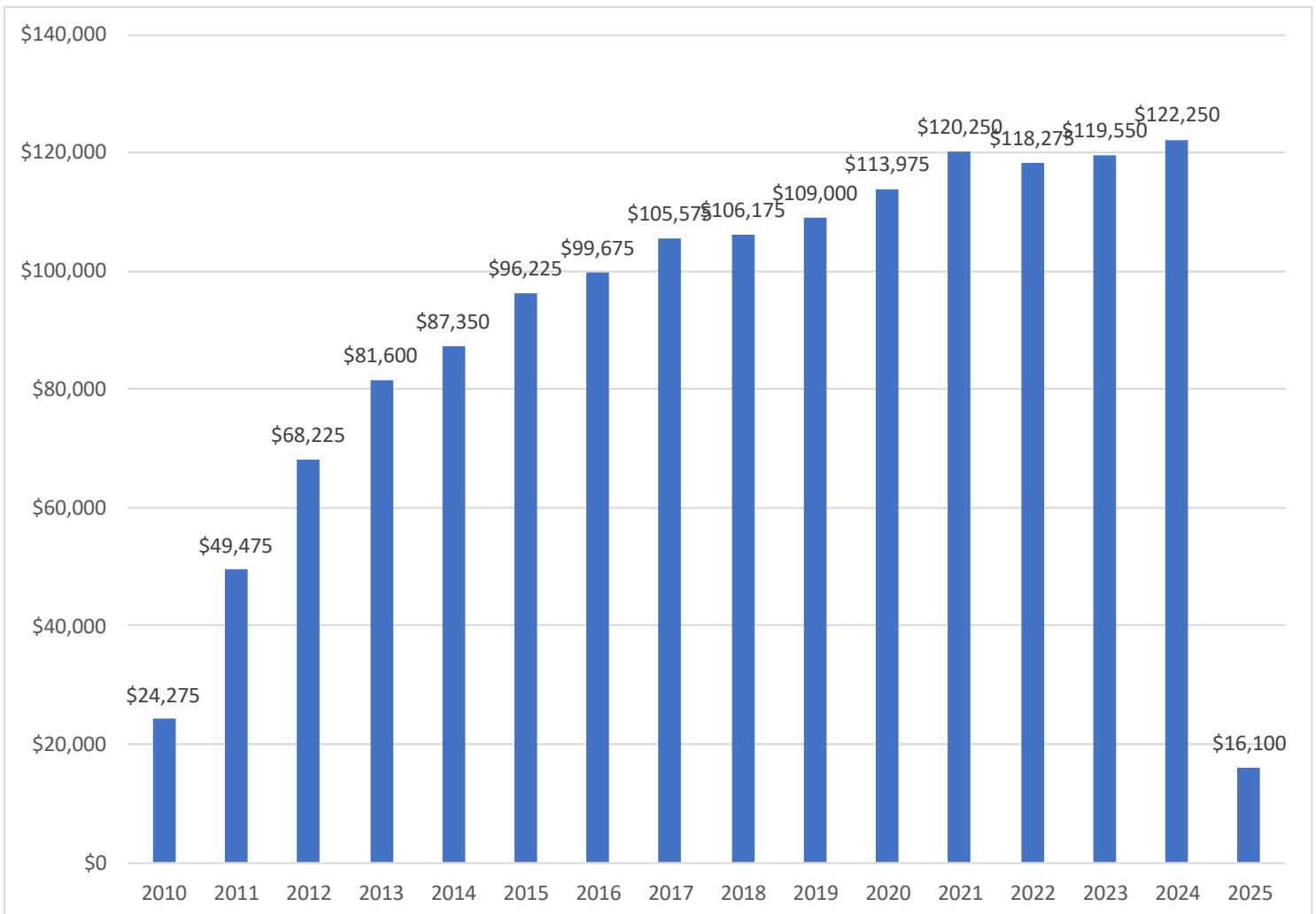

Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plates on the Streets As of February, 2025



As of February 28, 2025, we have 4,839 POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. The funds generated from the sale of the POW/MIA Specialty plate goes towards helping our Indiana Veterans in need through the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF). 421 plates were Renewed/Sold in February 2025.

Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate Fund From 2010 to 2025



Since the introduction of the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate in January 2010, the plate has generated an estimated \$1,421,875. 100% of the proceeds generated from the sales of the POW/MIA specialty plate goes to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF) to help our Indiana Veterans in need.

If you don't have an Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate on your vehicle, please let the Bureau Motor Vehicle (BMV) know that you would like to purchase a Rolling Thunder® sponsored POW/MIA specialty plate on your next renewal or new purchase.

With the purchase of an Indiana POW/MIA specialty plate, not only will you be instrumental in helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs and MIAs, you will be helping our Indiana Veterans in need.

Chapter Scholarship Program



The Chapter is giving back to the family members of our Indiana heroes by offering a \$1,000 scholarship to a high school senior or student receiving the GED, seeking a higher education at an accredited college, university, or trade school. This scholarship opportunity is only available to family members that are residents of Indiana and have a verifiable family relationship to a former POW or MIA.

The Chapter Scholarship started in 2021 and has helped four of our MIA families in continuing their education to better their lives. The Chapter has generously donated \$4,000 in Scholarship funds to our MIA family members since 2021.

To be eligible for this Scholarship, the applicant must be a resident of Indiana and have a verifiable familial relationship to a former Prisoner of War (POW) or Missing in Action (MIA). The student applying for the scholarship will be required to independently write an essay on a POW/MIA themed topic of their choosing. The theme of the essay should be original and based on an event, person, philosophy or ideal.

Possible topic themes might be a discussion of POWs during a particular war (Revolutionary War, Civil War, WWI, etc.), POW encampments such as in Andersonville, Georgia, Camp Atterbury, Camp Morton, internment camps of Japanese-Americans during WWII.

The deadline for application submission is **April 30, 2025**. Winner announcement and scholarship award will be made by June 30, 2025.

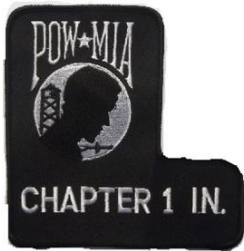

Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations

National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rocker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. **A \$50.00 patch deposit is required**



The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing, they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, **which is the property of National.** **A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.**

Membership Obligations

Retrieve Patches: It's the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not renew dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. **The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.**

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package CERTIFIED or PRIORITY mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

Please DO NOT Glue your patches on your vest. National will NOT accept damaged patches and you may lose your patch refund.
