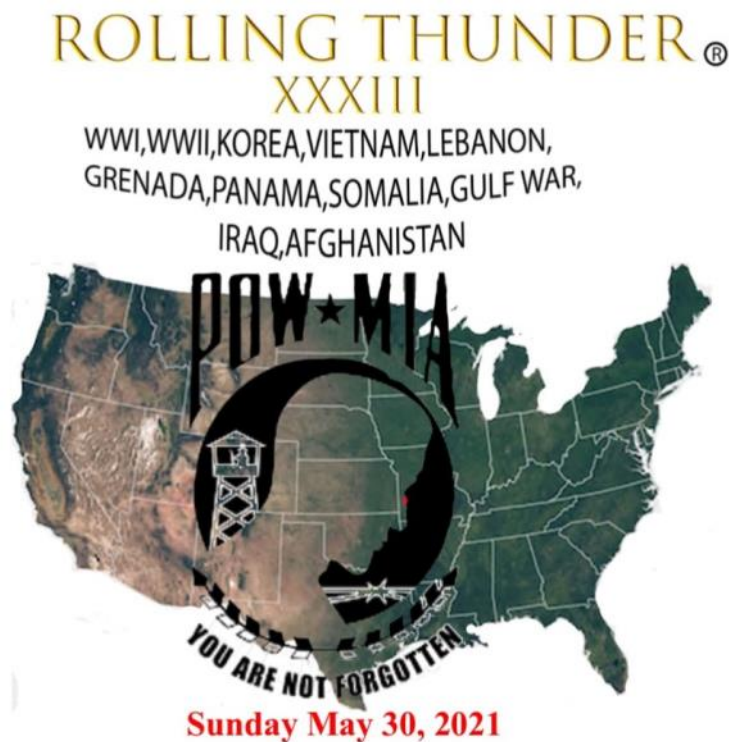
Indiana Rolling Thunder® XXXIII Ride for Freedom

Scholarship Programs

The Chapter gives back to our younger generations by offering two different scholarship opportunities.

The **Linda Smith-Cope scholarship** was created in honor of Linda Cope who unexpectedly passed away in 2019. Linda was a member of the Chapter and sister of Ronald E. Smith who is one of our Indiana MIAs from the Vietnam War. Linda went to High School in Covington Indiana, so the scholarship is only offered to Covington High School students.

The **Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter #1 Scholarship** was created for family members of our Indiana Former Prisoners of War (POW) and those that are still Missing in Action (MIA). The Chapter believes its important to give back to the family members that have suffered from their loved one being in captivity and those that still don't know the whereabouts of their loved one.

Linda Smith-Cope Scholarship

This scholarship is to honor Linda's spirit, and not only remember her brother Ronald E. Smith but all those that have yet to come home to family and friends from all past wars. A \$1,000 scholarship is to be awarded annually (2021 to 2022) to a Covington Community High School, Covington, Indiana graduating senior seeking a higher education at an accredited College, University, or Trade School.

I'm happy to announce that we had two applications submitted for the Linda Smith-Cope Scholarship award. The scholarship committee has reviewed the two applications and has chosen a winner. The winner will be announced at the May 16th Chapter meeting.

Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter #1 Scholarship

This \$1,000 scholarship opportunity is available only to the family members of our Indiana Former POWs or MIAs that are high school senior or student receiving the GED seeking a higher education at an accredited college, university, or trade school.

I'm happy to announce that we had two applications submitted for the Chapters POW/MIA Scholarship award. One application was from the Great Granddaughter of a Korean War MIA, and the other was from the Great Granddaughter of a Vietnam War MIA. The scholarship committee is in the process of reviewing the two applications and will choose a winner soon. The winner will be announced when known.

I want to thank the Linda Smith-Cope Scholarship, and the Chapters POW/MIA Scholarship committees for a job well done. The Chapter can be proud that we have given back to the community in a positive way.

Rolling Thunder® , Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations

National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rocker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. **A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.**



The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing ,they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, **which is the property of National.** **A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.**

Membership Obligations

B) Retrieve Patches: It is the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not renew dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. **The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.**

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package CERTIFIED or PRIORITY mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

A Brief History of Arlington Cemetery

George Washington's adopted son --- his wife Martha's only surviving son --- bought the land that became Arlington in 1778 to be closer to his mother and his stepfather at their beloved Mount Vernon. General Washington advised him on the purchase in correspondence from his winter camp at Valley Forge. But our national triumph three years later at Yorktown shattered the family's dreams. Their son died of a fever contracted there, leaving behind a six-month-old son of his own. George and Martha raised the boy, who was named George Washington Parke Custis but was known as Wash. When Wash came of age and inherited the land, he initially christened it Mount Washington, in honor of his revered adoptive father. Though he later renamed it Arlington, Wash used the land as a kind of public memorial in his lifelong mission to honor the great man. From hosting celebrations on Washington's birthday to displaying artifacts and memorabilia to building a grand mansion still visible from the Lincoln Memorial today, Arlington got its start as a shrine to the father of our country.



A new resident arrived in 1831, when then --- Lieutenant Robert E. Lee --- himself the son of Washington's trusted cavalry commander during the Revolutionary War --- married Wash's only surviving child, Mary. For 30 years, the Lees made Arlington their home and raised a family there between his military assignments. Because of his ties to Washington and his own military genius, Lee was offered command of a Union army as the Civil War started. But he declined on the spot. His long-time mentor --- none other than the 3rd Infantry's old commander, Winfield Scott, now the General-in-Chief of the Army --- scolded him: "Lee, you have made the greatest mistake of your life, but I feared it would be so." Resigning his commission, Lee left Arlington for Richmond, never to return. The United States Army occupied Arlington on May 24, 1861 --- and it has held the ground ever since.

Arlington at first became a military post, key terrain for the defense of the capital. The Old Guard even camped there for a few days in the summer of 1861. But as the horrific war ground on, casualties mounted and Washington's cemeteries filled up. Montgomery Meigs, the Quartermaster General, and Edwin Stanton, the Secretary of War, detested Lee as a traitor and saw a double opportunity: by turning Arlington into a Union cemetery, they gained hundreds of acres in new land for graves, while also foreclosing Lee's return after the war. On May 13, 1864, Private William Christman was the first soldier interred at Arlington. Thousands more would soon join him, fixing Arlington as a new national cemetery.

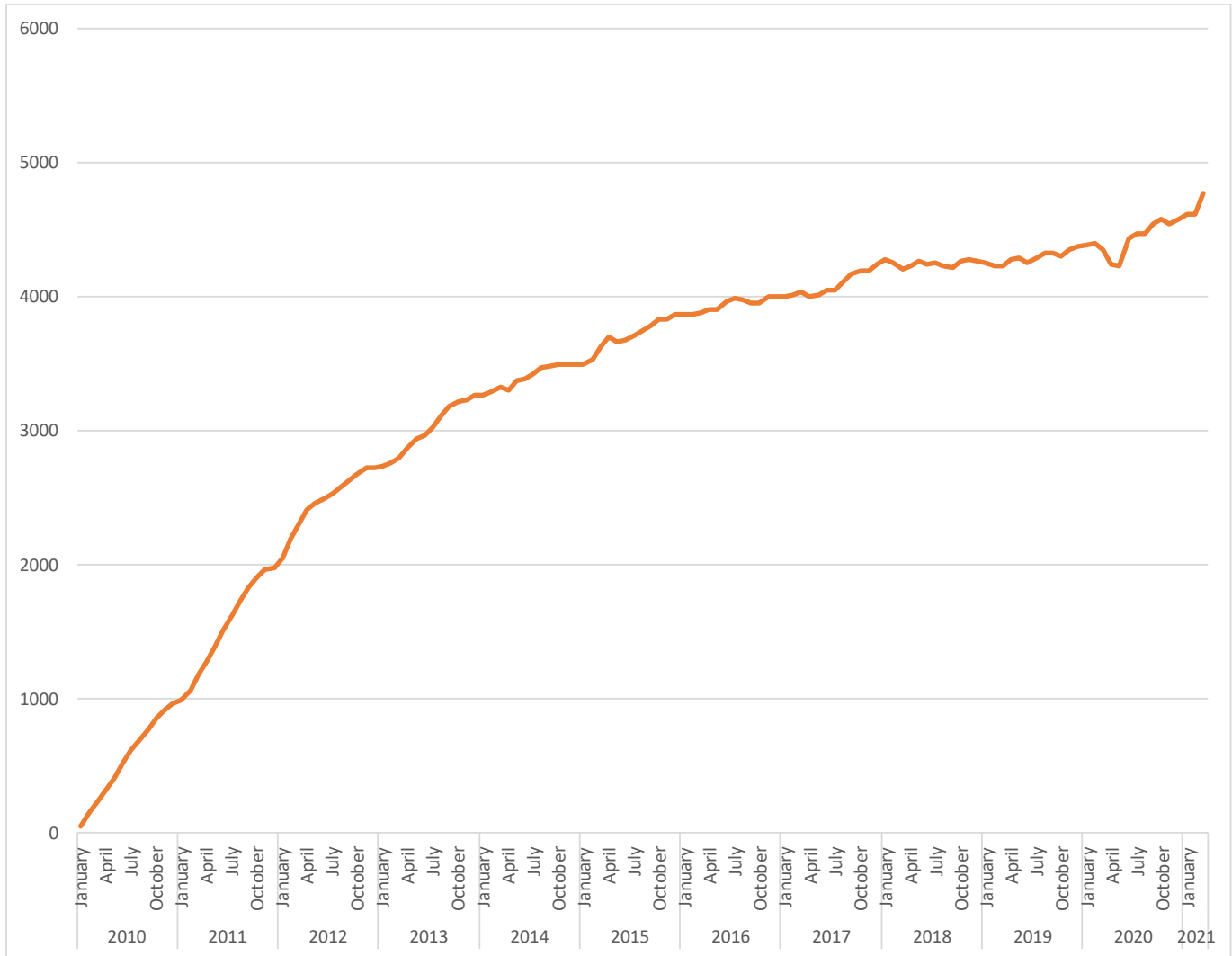
Arlington's seal calls it "Our Nation's Most Sacred Shrine." To borrow from Tocqueville in a different context, those rolling hills seem "called by some the secret design of Providence" to become our national cemetery.



Or so it was thought, Lee's son inherited the family's claim to their old farm. Himself a Confederate officer, his name nevertheless reflected the nation's deep roots at Arlington: George Washington Custis Lee. Known as Custis, he petitioned Congress to no avail, then sued in federal court to evict the Army as trespassers. *United States v. Lee* worked its way over the years to the Supreme Court, which upheld the Lee family's claim. Fortunately for the government, the nation, and the souls at rest in Arlington, Custis was magnanimous in victory, asking only for just compensation. In 1883, he deeded the land back to the government in return for \$150,000. The Secretary of War who accepted the deed was Robert Todd Lincoln, the son of Abraham Lincoln. After that final act of reconciliation between the firstborn sons of the great president and his family's rebel antagonist, Arlington's dead could rest in peace for eternity.

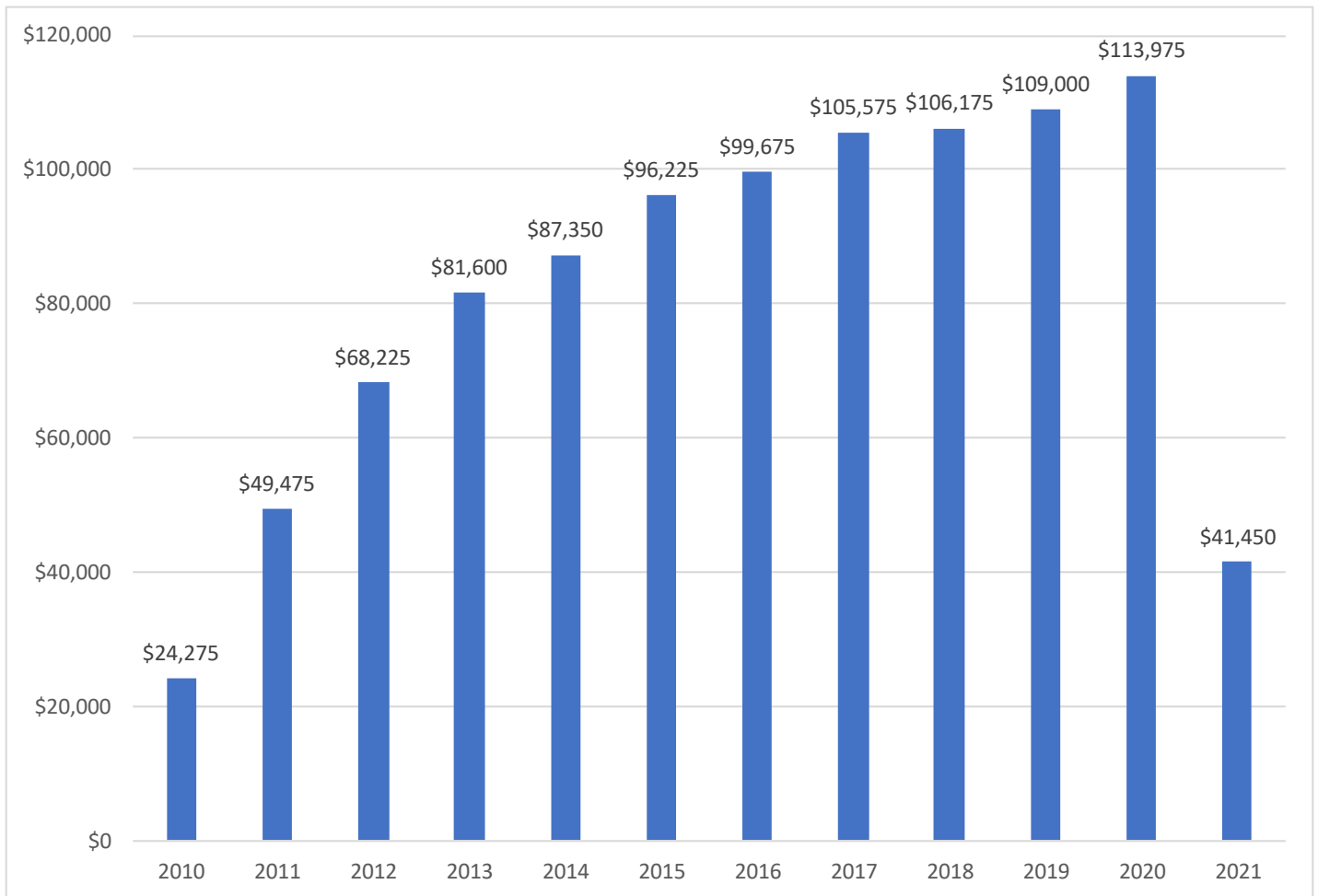
