A funeral service will be held at 11:00 AM on Tuesday, September 14, 2021 at the LifeGate Church in Logansport. Burial with full Military Graveside Rites will follow at Mount Hope Cemetery, Logansport.

Watchfire Ceremony

The Watchfire is centuries old and had its origins in our country during the American Revolutionary War for independence. It is symbolic as a beacon, a guiding light for those service members who did not return home. It burns brightly so their spirits may see this light and know the love and respect we carry in our hearts for their sacrifice.

The flame is an eternal symbol of our collective memory as a nation, born from ideals of freedom and honor. It calls us to solemn attention to the work before us on this evening of remembrance. As we reverently and proudly voice the name of each service member, let us maintain order and quiet reverence as a message of our grateful appreciation for their great personal sacrifice and devotion to the future of our nation.

The Watchfire ceremony will be held on Friday evening at the Indiana War Memorial. The names of the 1,727 Indiana Service Members that are still unaccounted for since WWII will be read and a flag will be placed on the grounds of the War Memorial in their honor.

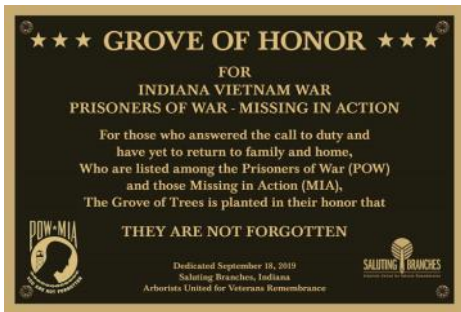

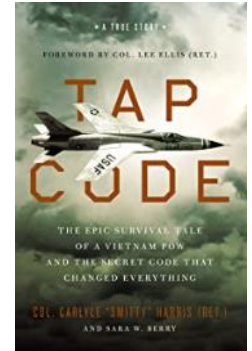

TAP CODE

By Col. Carlyle “Smitty” Harris (ret) and Sara W. Berry

Tap Code was the renowned method of communication for prisoners of war (POW) during the Vietnam War. It was Col. Carlyle “Smitty” Harris, shot down on April 4, 1965, that introduced the *Tap Code* which became widely used by the POWs to communicate with each other when they were unable to talk or whisper. Smitty was shot down in his F-105 while on a bombing mission on the Hâm Rong bridge in North Vietnam. Smitty was quickly captured and held as a prisoner for nearly eight years. Smitty was the sixth American POW captured in North Vietnam. Today he lives in Tupelo, Mississippi with his loving wife Louise.



The book is an accounting of Smitty’s ordeal as a POW, the genesis of the *Tap Code* in Vietnam, and the life of a wife and family of a POW. This book has received stellar reviews. Once you start it you will not want to put it down.

The *Tap Code* that was used is explained by a five-by-five matrix of the alphabet. Unlike the Morse code that uses short and long, dots and dashes, audible sounds, taps are used to identify a letter by the row and column in which the letter is found in the matrix. The letter K is missing from the matrix. When needed the letter C is tapped out slowly.

As a salutation or at the end of a day you would hear: tap tap, tap for G, then tap, tap tap for B then tap tap tap tap, tap tap tap tap tap for U. GBU or meaning God Bless You.

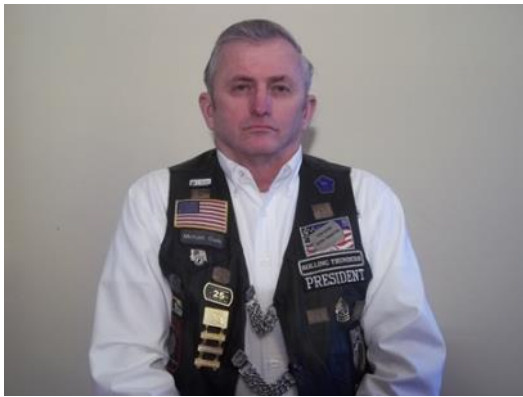

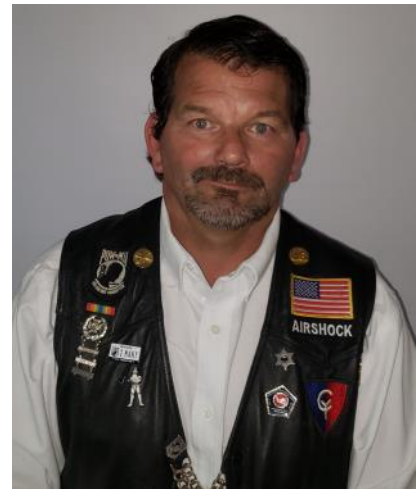

- Must abide by the Rolling Thunder® National Constitution Rules of Conduct at all times.
- Have a working knowledge of the National Constitution and Chapter Rules found on the Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter 1 website.

Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations

National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rocker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. **A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.**



The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing, they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, **which is the property of National.** **A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.**

Membership Obligations

Retrieve Patches: It is the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not renew dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. **The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.**

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package CERTIFIED or PRIORITY mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

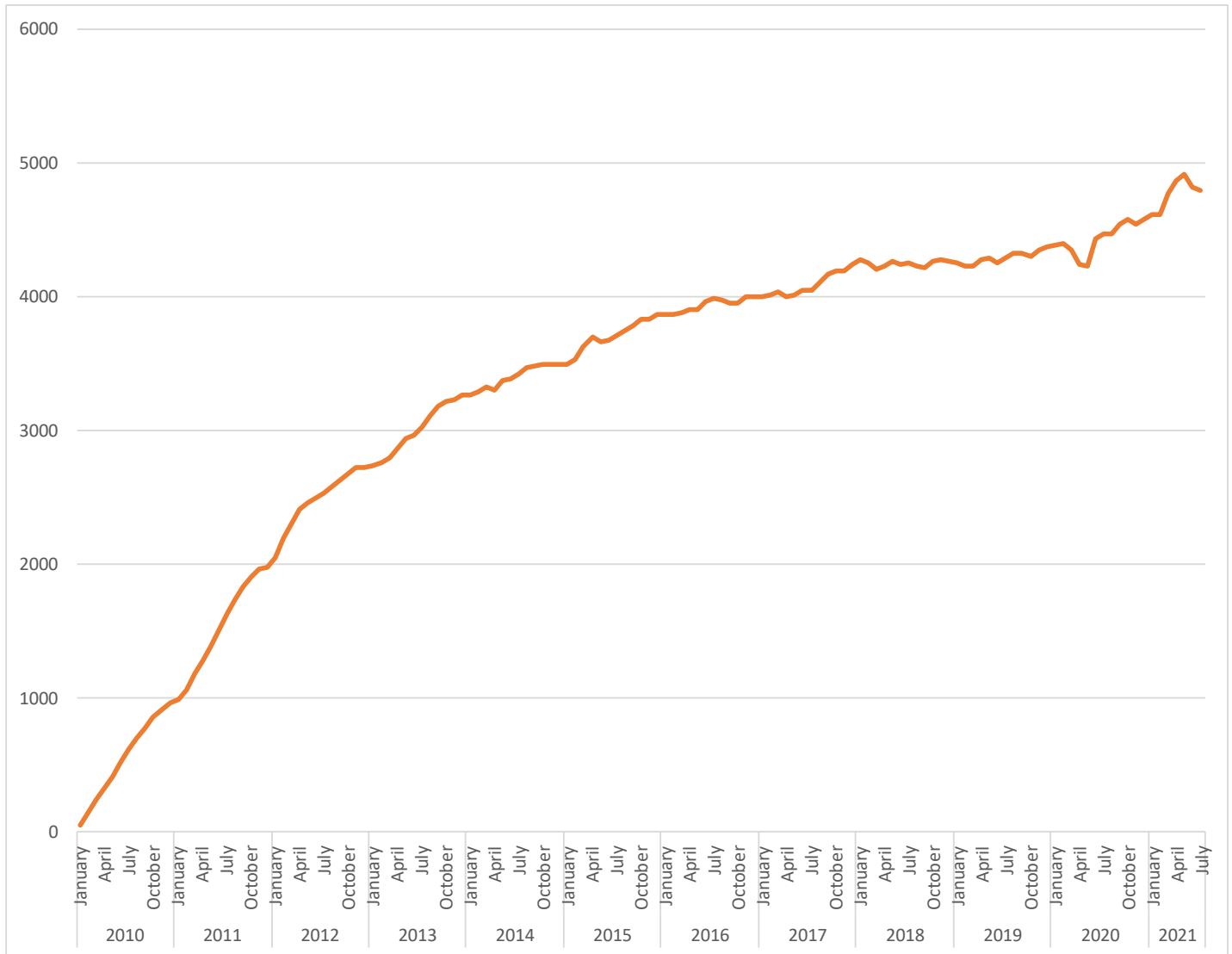

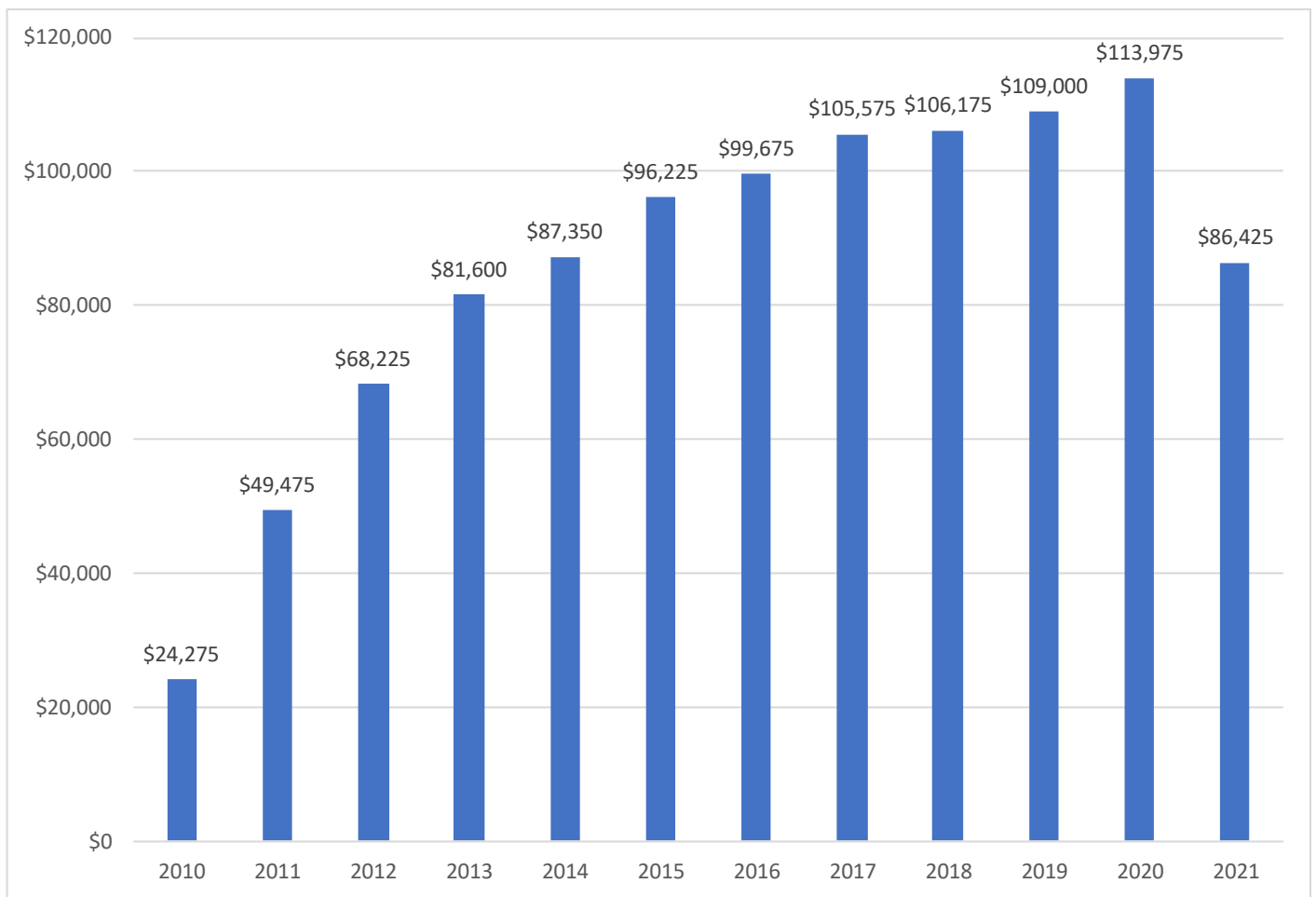
