USS Indianapolis and bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki Japan

The Indianapolis was a Portland class heavy cruiser of the United States Navy. Launched in 1931 and commissioned in 1932. Damaged by a kamikaze off Okinawa in 31 March 1945. She returned to the Mare Island naval ship yard in San Francisco Bay for repairs. After two months in the yard, she was stocked with supply's and fuel and was getting ready for a shakedown cruise when the Capt. received secret orders.

He was to take a secret cargo to the Island of Tinian Island as fast as possible. The cargo consisted of a gun barrel and a 5 lb. uranium 235 projectile, about the size of a tomato soup can, for Little Boy, the Atomic bomb dropped on Hiroshima.

She departed San Francisco on the morning of 16 July, arriving at Tinian on 26 July with a fuel stop in Hawaii. Departed Tinian for Guam. Ordered to report to a task force off of Letye, she was sunk by a Japanese Sub. on 30 July. On Aug. 2, the survivors were sighted by American plane on sub. patrol. A PBY was sent to investigate.

About 10 ships were sent to pick up the survivors. On 3 Aug. the rescue was complete. Of the 1196 crewmen on board, only 317 survived. Also on this day, a flight of planes from the states arrived at Tinian. One plane carried the larger piece of Uranium U235. This was the target for the gun in Little Boy. The total weight of the U235 in Little Boy was about 22 lbs. Another plane carried the Plutonium core for Fat Man, the bomb the was dropped on Nagasaki. The plutonium core weighed about 80 lbs.

The Enola Gay dropped Little Boy on Hiroshima on 6 Aug. about 8:16 AM. After the drop, the Enola Gay immediately executed a diving 155 degree turn to the right to escape the bomb blast. The Enola Gay had just 43 secs. The bomb was released just above 31, 000 feet. After a short time, a timer tripped. A barometric switch tripped at 5,000 ft. At about 1850 ft. a radar altimeter activated the detonator in the tail of Little Boy, igniting the powder charge, sending the U235 projectile (2000 ft per sec) into the target at the muzzle of the barrel. This caused a nuclear explosion over a live target. 60 percent of Hiroshima was destroyed. 20 percent of her population died. There were 23 America prisoners of war in Hiroshima on 6 Aug. The United States were not aware of this.

I was requested to write this article for Rolling Thunder's monthly newsletter. I do so in memory of the 1196 crew members of the USS Indianapolis CA35 and the 7 AAF and 2 Navy aviators in Hiroshima on the morning of 6 August, 1945

We as American's must never forget the hardship that these families have endured with the lost, or not knowing the whereabouts of their loved one.

Rolling Thunder® Indiana Chapter #1 is honored to provide these two young ladies with a \$1,000 scholarship to continue their education.

Emily Brechenser: Emily is the Granddaughter of William T. Brechenser who was a Private First Class in the Army Infantry. PFC Brechenser was captured on Christmas Eve 1944 in Luxembourg. He was in a German POW camp for three months before being liberated while on a train inbound to Germany.

Emily will pursue a degree at Indiana University in Kinesiology as a pre-physical therapy major. We wish Emily the best in her continuing education at Indiana University.

Sydney Groves: Sydney is the Great-Niece of Specialist 5 Michael Lautzenheiser. On October 26, 1971, a CH-47 Chinook (tail number 66-19143, call sign "Warrior 143") with five crew members and five passengers aboard left Tuy Hoa, South Vietnam, on a supply mission to Cam Rahn Bay, South Vietnam. The helicopter encountered inclement weather and lost radio communication before it crashed into the water off the coast of Nha Trang. Search and rescue missions recovered four bodies and retrieved debris that washed ashore on Hon Tre Island. Specialist Lautzenheiser and six other men aboard the helicopter remain missing.



Wheelchair Ramp for Sandra Rigdon Brazil Indiana

Sandra is the Daughter of Seaman 1st Class Eldridge Wayne Bowles. Seaman Bowes reported for duty aboard the USS Indianapolis on October 8, 1943. Seaman Bowles was one of 879 men that was killed or lost at sea when the Japanese sank the USS Indianapolis on July 30th, 1945. Eldridge was 31 years old when he was lost sea.

Sandra was only a few months old when she lost her dad and never got a chance to know her father. This is the sad story of many of our war-fighters, and we need to make sure they and their families are not forgotten.

The Chapter gave Sandra a POW/MIA Flag to fly at her home, but she didn't have a flag pole for the flag. Sandra also mentioned that her husband Clyde, needed an Wheelchair ramp so he could get in and out of their home better. These two issues were presented to the Board, and Membership and was approved by all.

The Chapter purchased a flag pole and hired a contractor to build the wheelchair ramp. The contractor installed the flag pole and completed the ramp on August 26th. Below is some pictures of before and after the ramp was built.

Board/Chapter Meeting and Elections



Saluting Branches at Indiana Veterans Home



Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plates on the Streets As of July 31, 2023



As of July 31, 2023, we have **4,811** POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. The funds generated from the sale of the POW/MIA Specialty plate goes towards helping our Indiana Veterans in need through the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF). 439 plates were Renewed/Sold in July, 2023. **We are 10 plates up from July 2022.**

Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate Fund From 2010 to 2023



Since the introduction of the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate in January 2010, the plate has generated an estimated \$1,255,325. 100% of the proceeds generated from the sales of the POW/MIA specialty plate goes to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF) to help our Indiana Veterans in need.

If you don't have a Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate on your vehicle, please let the Bureau Motor Vehicle (BMV) know that you would like to purchase a Rolling Thunder® sponsored POW/MIA specialty plate on your next renewal or new purchase.

With the purchase of a Indiana POW/MIA specialty plate, not only will you be instrumental in helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs and MIAs, you will be helping our Indiana Veterans in need.

Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rocker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.



The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing ,they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, which is the property of National. A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.

Membership Obligations

Retrieve Patches: It's the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not renew dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package **CERTIFIED** or **PRIORITY** mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

Please DO NOT Glue your patches on your vest. National will NOT accept damaged patches and you may lose your patch refund.


