### Jesus Quintana JR February 19, 1949 - November 7, 2024



Jesus Quintana Jr., 75, of Indianapolis passed away on November 7, 2024. He was born in Mercedes, Texas on February 19, 1949, to his parents, Jesus Quintana and Maria (Ochoa) Quintana. His parents relocated to Indianapolis, Indiana when Jesus was very young.

Jesus enlisted in the United States Marines on June 29, 1967, and dutifully served his country for many years. He was Honorably Discharged from the Marine Corps after being wounded in Vietnam. He lost both of his legs as a result of his wounds and was eventually awarded a total of 3 Purple Hearts for his injuries and Bronze Star. Jesus was a very proud Marine who volunteered with VA Hospital throughout the years of his retirement. He was a Veterans service officer for the Department of Veterans Affairs. Jesus was a proud Christian and served as Chaplain for the Marine Corps League Bearss Detachment #089. He was a member of numerous other military organizations.



Jesus was also an active members of the Indianapolis POW/MIA Council for many years. Jesus was responsible for the team that rang the bell during the POW/MIA Recognition Day Ceremony, and represented the United States Marine CORPS.

I'm proud of the Chapter for these accomplishments and looking forwarded to what the Chapter will accomplish in 2025.

### Christmas on the WWII Home Front

- During World War II Christmas trees were in short supply because of a lack of manpower to cut the trees down and a shortage of railroad space to ship the trees to market. Americans rushed to buy American-made Visca artificial trees.
- In 1941, a five-foot Christmas tree could be purchased for 75 cents.
- The shortage of materials—like aluminum and tin—used to produce ornaments led many people to make their own ornaments at home. Magazines contained patterns for ornaments made out of non-priority war materials, like paper, string, and natural objects, such as pinecones or nuts.
- Electric bubble lights were created during the 1940s and remain popular even today.
- A Merry Policy
- To give their Christmas tree a snow-covered effect, people mixed a box of Lux soap powder with two cups of water and brushed the concoction on the branches of their tree.
- Fewer men at home resulted in fewer men available to dress up and play Santa Claus. Women served as substitute Santas at Saks Fifth Avenue in New York City and at other department stores throughout the United States.



- "I'll Be Home For Christmas" and "White Christmas" were both written during the 1940s and quickly gained popularity with the war-weary, but optimistic, population.
- Travel during the holidays was limited for most families due to the rationing of tires and gasoline. Americans saved up their food ration stamps to provide extra food for a fine holiday meal.
- Many Americans threw their German blown-glass ornaments and exotic Japanese ornaments in the trash as soon as the war began. Shortly after the war, Corning Glass Company in New York began mass-producing Christmas tree balls using machines designed to produce light bulbs. Corning could make more ornaments in a single minute than a German cottage glass blower could make in a whole day.

The Board and Executive meeting for December will be a Zoom meeting for Board and Executive members only. The Board meeting will start 18:30.


#### **Wreath Across America**


## Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plates on the Streets As of October 31, 2024



As of October 2024, we have **4,864** POW/MIA specialty plates on the streets of Indiana helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs, and MIAs. The funds generated from the sale of the POW/MIA Specialty plate goes towards helping our Indiana Veterans in need through the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF). **We are 22 plates up from this time last year**.

The November plate numbers will be provided at the December Chapter meeting.

### Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate Fund From 2010 to 2024



Since the introduction of the Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate in January 2010, the plate has generated an estimated \$1,408,700 100% of the proceeds generated from the sales of the POW/MIA specialty plate goes to the Indiana Military Family Relief Fund (MFRF) to help our Indiana Veterans in need.

If you don't have a Indiana POW/MIA Specialty Plate on your vehicle, please let the Bureau Motor Vehicle (BMV) know that you would like to purchase a Rolling Thunder® sponsored POW/MIA specialty plate on your next renewal or new purchase.

With the purchase of a Indiana POW/MIA specialty plate, not only will you be instrumental in helping to bring awareness to the public about our POWs and MIAs, you will be helping our Indiana Veterans in need.

## Rolling Thunder®, Inc. Membership Patches and Obligations National Constitution

The Rolling Thunder® patches are items that members strive to obtain. The Boot patch represents the members Chapter, and the Rocker and Eagle represents Rolling Thunder® National. These patches should be worn proudly and with respect. When a member is issued these patches, they have an obligation to take care of them and turn them in if they decide to quit Rolling Thunder® for whatever reason. Below is an abstract from the National Constitution on the members obligations that they agree to when they receive these patches.



The Chapter Boot Patch. All members will receive a Rolling Thunder® Membership Boot patch when they become a full member at the end of a 120-day period. If a member meets his/her obligations before the 120 days are up they are entitled to receive their Boot patch no earlier than 90 days, provided they meet all other (loyalty and conduct) requirements. A new member must make 3 meetings or events, or a combination thereof, during the 120-day trial period to become a full member. A \$50.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Boot Patch.



The Rocker and Eagle Patches. After a member completes his/her first year (from the day they receive their boot patch) as a member in good standing ,they will be issued the Eagle & Rocker patches, which is the property of National. A \$100.00 patch deposit is required before National will issue the Rocker and Eagle Patches.

### **Membership Obligations**

Retrieve Patches: It's the Chapters responsibility to retrieve all patches. If a member does not renew dues in a reasonable time, thirty days from the end of February the Chapter President or his appointed representative will collect their patches. Any Chapter that does not retrieve the members patches will be held liable for their cost. Any problems from a delinquent member to collect our property, if needed have a lawyer send a letter and take them to court (quote the constitution) that a member will pay all court and lawyers fees. The Chapter will pay National \$150.00 per set lost and members deposit will not be refunded.

If you mail your patches to the Chapter, make sure you send the package **CERTIFIED** or **PRIORITY** mail for tracking purposes and insure the package for \$150.00.

Please DO NOT Glue your patches on your vest. National will NOT accept damaged patches and you may lose your patch refund.


